Dear People of God,

Last week I touched on one of the touchiest subjects in the Church – money. Today I want to touch on another – faith formation. Each of us has been summoned by God to become an evangelist, to "go forth and teach all nations, baptizing them." For most of us, that means regular assistance at the Sunday Mass by becoming part of the praying community to strengthen all those who really are out there on the front line doing the teaching and baptizing. We are all expected as part of our baptismal promises to take part in ongoing formation, perhaps a bible study session or turning on the TV to take in something on FORMED. One significant means of teaching and baptizing is to invite our friends and family to take part in the RCIA, Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults. Many of us probably know someone in the parish who comes faithfully every week but is not a Catholic. We can extend an invitation to that person to undertake the sessions leading to the Sacraments of Initiation. Perhaps we're married to or part of a family which has non-Catholic and unchurched members. Again, we can invite them to consider the RCIA. Now is the time to extend that invitation and to do so for several reasons. Obviously, the most important is to have people respond in time to begin classes in the fall which is closer than we may think. More important, though, is to grow our membership in the Body of Christ.

Each of us should be so excited by what we accomplish at Mass that we want to share it with others by bringing them into the fold. (If you're not excited, you may profit from attending RCIA yourself to refresh your knowledge of the power of the Sacraments – you can disguise your reason by offering to be a parish sponsor to accompany someone along the road to Easter.) You may also want to invite somebody you know who's fallen away to come along with you to the RCIA sessions as a means of bringing them home.

Preliminary recruitment for the RCIA will begin soon. Please consider inviting someone to be part of it. Many of those who enter our Church via the RCIA become its most vibrant and active members. Consider some invitations and pray as well about being a Parish Sponsor, a team member or a presenter if you have some expertise in the areas covered by the RCIA.

I have identified many opportunities for faith formation; consider enriching others and yourself by seizing one.







The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory at Historic St. Patrick @ 419-243-6452.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.


LISTEN LUMINOUS MYSTERIES
