Dear People of God,

I see the Ukraine War has exhausted its fifteen minutes of fame and has been relegated to the third or fourth page of the news, replaced by the righteous anger and frustration of Americans at the high price of just about everything and replaced in England by the latest Platinum Jubilee souvenir being snatched up by the people regardless of inflated prices. Elsewhere people have little time for anger or jubilation as natural disasters take their brief place in the sun of our 24-hour news cycle.

I'm often amazed at the brevity of our interest in what is shaping the future, whether in the world, in our community, or in our Church. Perhaps it's the result of our short lives in light of the eternity we know lies out there - we try to pack as much into our three-score and seven as we can. There are, however, some things we ought to hang on to and keep before our eyes for longer than fifteen minutes, not the least of which is our God.

Sadly, there is today a lack of interest in God and things divine. I'm not sure where this comes from since having been made in God's image and likeness, we have an innate sense of the divine "built in." God should be a constant in our thoughts and in our actions if for no other reason than that very "image and likeness." For instance, we ought to have a tremendous interior respect for and love of life since God is life and love. That respect is built in and it is why soldiers may come home with PTSD: deep down inside they have that built-in respect for life and a deeply rooted aversion to taking life or seeing it taken. Yet today we see a lack of that respect in places like the Ukraine where young men are being put on trial for killing innocent non-combatants in so-called "war crimes." We see much the same in the neighborhoods where there seems to be so little respect for life that shots are taken against cars with children in them, homes with children in them and innocents are being lost right here in Toledo, perhaps just down the street from your house.

The failure to keep our "God-sense" alive has cost a lot in terms of our society – there seems to be so little respect for life that someone can willy-nilly drive through a parade and run down innocents, walk into a synagogue and kill innocents, drive up to a hospital and kill innocents, invade a school and kill innocents. Each of us needs to be a person of faith and prayer with God always before our eyes. It can and will make a difference because respect spreads with the potential to grow and morph into a great movement which transforms society. Keep God first, please, and watch the miracle begin.

# The Celebration of Sacraments

**Infant Baptism**: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults:** RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory at Historic St. Patrick @ 419-243-6452.

**Penance**: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony**: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

**Pastoral Care of the Sick**: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
