Dear People of God,

It's hard to believe that we're over half way through the Liturgical Year. We've celebrated Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter and are now in that long period known as Ordinary Time. While the title is *ordinary*, what's happening isn't – it's supposed to be *extraordinary*!

The weeks leading us to the conclusion of the Liturgical year are meant to be the time devoted by the faithful to putting into practice what was learned during the High Holy Days. Each Season imparts some particular directive which ought to shape how we celebrate, pray and give due adoration and honor to God. Unfortunately, all too often, because it's just *ordinary*, it risks becoming something to skip through or skip altogether when it should be a time for a heightened experience of the actual work of being a Christian and a Catholic, to branch out from the pew into the world to proclaim the wonder of the God of Love.

Let's review what we should have picked up from the seasons and perhaps see how it could be used to make *Ordinary* Time *Extraordinary*.

Advent: Expectation and hope. What do you, or we as a community, expect tomorrow or down the way in our pilgrimage toward the end times? Do we take actual time to consider tomorrow or the distant future of parish and church? Do we bring to our expectations a hope for the real presence of Jesus Christ in our actions, lives, celebrations and in the world around us?

Christmas: Fulfillment, presence, gift. Jesus' birth was the end point of at least two thousand years of prophesy and promise. He is himself God's gift of himself to the world, and to each of us in a special way through baptism and the other sacraments. Do we truly appreciate the gift of Jesus? The wonder of his presence in the Eucharist? The miracle of his presence in each of us?

Lent: Remorse, sorrow, reconciliation. The tragedy of Jesus' suffering and death are the fault of our sinfulness, not just that of Adam and Eve. We all sin. Are we remorseful for the damage done to ourselves, others and the world because of our sin? Do we adequately express our sorrow and seek and give forgiveness to others?

Easter: Triumph, life over death, resurrection. These terms all point to a time beyond time, after physical death and the end of all things. Are we ready for that? Are we prepared for our own death? Have we planned for the day when we're no longer here?

Ordinary Time is a chance to do our homework and advance along the way to God's kingdom. This is a year to make it *extraordinary*.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

<u>Matrimony</u>: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

<u>Pastoral Care of the Sick</u>: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.




