Dear People of God,

This Sunday marks the anniversary of one of the great tragedies in American History known as 9/11 but more formally understood as a terrorist attack against the Twin Towers in New York City, the Pentagon in Arlington, and the flight 93 crash in Pennsylvania. Notable memorials have been established at each of those sites; perhaps you've been able to visit one of them to offer a prayer for the nearly three thousand men, women and children who died as the result of those attacks. As we pause today to consider the horror of that day, we should also take time to reflect on the hatred which spawned the terrorists to undertake their hijacking and flying into American buildings. Terrorism hasn't gone away despite trillions of dollars spent attempting to destroy the roots of the groups responsible; in fact, it seems that we read more and more about terrorism around the world and right here in the USA.

The underlying cause of the hatred we see being expressed in terrorist attacks and the unconscionable gun violence we experience every day here at home is a grave failure to live the Great Commandment God gave at the very beginning of human culture: Love God and love your neighbor as you love yourself. There are three elements to that equation: a) love of the divine creator, b) love of oneself and c) love of others. A quick look at contemporary America or at just about anywhere in the world will reveal that all three of those elements are in serious trouble. Love of God isn't something we can restrict to a sunny glade in the forest or a quiet corner in the living room; it's a summons to a community of like believers whose mutual support enlivens and strengthens the love we offer to God. Sadly, the numbers of people attending church services of every kind have fallen dramatically.

Watching television gives us a glimpse of the mental health of the nation: the number of pills and prescriptions for anxiety, bi-polar disorders and other mental conditions as well as reports of the disastrous effects of bullying and neglect of our children leading to acts of violence and suicide certainly attest to the lack of love of self for far too many, especially the young. The homicide rate, assault crimes, and domestic violence all point to a serious failure to love others.

The answer to these societal ills will only come from a concerted effort by people of faith to proclaim the Good News that God is real, God loves us and is always there to share that love. As Catholics we can do that best by living our Catholic faith and that means joining the faithful every week to be encouraged and loved, fed with the real presence of Jesus the Christ, and then going out into the world refreshed and excited by what we have seen, heard and done. Other faith communities have their own ways and means of accomplishing that same end of being loved so they can also truly love others.

As we remember the loss of those three thousand, let us pray that by becoming people of genuine faith, we can prevent similar acts in the future.

### The Celebration of Sacraments

**Infant Baptism**: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults**: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. **Penance**: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony**: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

**Pastoral Care of the Sick:** When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
