Dear People of God,

Last week I began a series on the Mysteries of the Most Holy Rosary (I've used that specific title to remind everyone of the patroness of the diocese and the focus in October on the rosary). I mentioned that each of the mysteries reveals something about the human condition, the way you and I live out our lives. General aspects of existence are covered by the sets of five: today let's take a look at the Joyful Mysteries which are and which should get us thinking about these Joyful events.

The Annunciation – The mystery is about Mary and an angel who shares some good news about a long-awaited event. It's about us as we do our own waiting for good news. That could be the end of the war in Ukraine, the end of the drought in the west, the conclusion of a college program, the word that we're going to be grandparents or a host of other things we anticipate with great longing and fervent hope. As you reflect on the mystery, reflect on your own current hopes.

The Visitation – The mystery is about Mary and Elizabeth, caring and welcome. It's about those moments when we take time, even if it costs us, to visit those in need. Perhaps it's an aged parent who needs dinner provided by us or maybe it's a neighbor who's just lost a loved one. It could even be a stop at the maternity ward to gaze at the new born grandchild. As you reflect on the mystery, think about who you ought to go visit.

The Nativity – The Mystery is about Mary giving birth to Jesus, about Joseph helping deliver the child. It's about the times in our life when newness springs forth. It could simply be restricted in our thoughts to babies, but it's a lot more than that: maybe a new job, a new house, a new car, a new school year, a new snow shovel in anticipation of winter for those few who find joy in all that snow. Give thought to what's new in your life and why it gives you joy.

The Presentation – The mystery is about Mary, Joseph, Jesus and the Church town to which they belonged. It's about you and me and the fidelity we owe to our own Church, whether the parish or the diocese or the Universal Catholic Church. As we reflect on this one, we might give some thought to how much time we spend in prayer, what we do for the larger Church by way of service and even how the donations we make give joy to a pastor, a diocese or the Holy Father attempting to meet the needs of the poor globally.

The Finding – The mystery is about Mary, Joseph, Jesus and traveling. It's also about us and the times we travel to get together with family or other times when somebody or something gets "lost." We travel a lot in our modern society: sometimes when we get to a restaurant, we can't find our glasses to read the menu. Sometimes we might drive on past that nice hotel where we made reservations. Today it is not uncommon to have a flight delayed or canceled. Nevertheless, the vacation seems to move onward despite those losses because the glasses were in the car, the hotel is just a mile or two behind us and the next flight is a direct one that saves us four or five hours.

The intent of these discussions of the various Mysteries is to enhance our own prayerful recitation of the rosary. I hope these ideas about the Joyful Mysteries will do just that for you.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory at Historic St. Patrick @ 419-243-6452.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.



Historic South Initiative's home repair program helps residents in the Old South End repair issues to the outside of their home that are related to lead hazards, safety, and sanitation. The following repairs qualify:

New windows and/or doors, New siding and/or painting, Roof repair and/or replacement, Gutter replacement, Exterior asbestos removal

To qualify, you must meet these requirements:

- Be in the target area of I-75 highway to Broadway to Walbridge Ave, back to I-75.
- Be the owner of the property.
- Be current on home taxes. If not current, must make a down payment towards a payment plan and pay up to 3 months before being eligible.
- House having a sound structural quality.


St. Francis of Assisi: Sign of Contradiction


