

Dear people of God,

Although I began a series on the mysteries of the Rosary, I want to break into that series with a comment or two on the Living Christ Capital campaign. Our parish is in Phase Two of the three-phase campaign. Each phase is divided to have about a third of the 122 parishes in our diocese; the campaign challenges us to consider and secure the future for both diocese and parish by creating and funding several important endowments as well as raising funds in the parish for some much-needed maintenance projects. Already I and several volunteers have started contacting parishioners in the hope of securing contributions which will provide inspiring leadership as we expand our outreach to everyone. All of the parish families will be contacted and asked to pray about assisting in the campaign which seeks to raise \$65,000,000, 35% of which will be utilized by parishes for projects each has chosen as its own. The other 65% will be seeded into several key endowments to address future needs of the diocese and parishes. As of this writing (in mid-September) the diocesan goal has been about 65% covered by pledges and donations. Given the current economic challenges we all face, this initial success pays tribute to the willingness of our Diocesan citizens to sacrifice and support this worthy campaign.

The endowments are spread across areas of concern identified by the Diocese, the College of Consultors (I was one) and the Diocesan Finance Council as needing more annual income than can be generated by the ACA (Annual Catholic Appeal) and in part to reduce some yearly appeals now being made. The 8 goal areas are as follows:

An endowment to fund programs for healthy parishes.

An endowment to secure the viability of the Priests' Retirement Fund.

An endowment to assure the future support of diocesan seminarians.

An endowment to fund expanded Catholic Charities services across the diocese.

An endowment to enhance the Catholic identity and content of our schools.

An endowment to fund campus ministry on all of the many college campuses across the diocese.

An endowment to assure the future maintenance of the cathedral.

An endowment to fund lay leadership training in the years ahead.

Two capital investment projects are also included in the Living Christ Campaign: Immediate work on the cathedral and construction of an enhanced Helping Hands of St. Louis Outreach center on Toledo's East Side.

Endowments are secured trusts which can only be tapped for earnings and potentially a considered small portion of the principal if needed as outlined by the founding charter and cannot be used for anything else. No borrowing from Peter to pay Paul. Each endowment will have its own board of overseers, experts in financial matters, to assure the orderly stewardship of your donations to make sure the endowed funds bring a return on investments to provide both earnings and growth.

As we move forward on this campaign, please pray and allow the spirit to guide you. The pledge suggests a five-year redemption and as the endowments grow, it is hoped some of the current annual fund drives might be reduced. As of today, before the October 15 kick off of the general drive, our parish has raised \$ 48,500 in pledges, a promising start.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory at Historic St. Patrick @ 419-243-6452.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.




