Dear People of God,

I've been looking at the mysteries of the Rosary and have now arrived at the traditional Sorrowful Mysteries. Like the other sets, they are supposed to evoke the feelings of sorrow that are such an ordinary part of our human existence. Many things, events, people and places can lead us to feel sad and perhaps even isolated. That's ordinary and human and okay as we can see from Jesus' triumphant handling of each of the moments of these sorrowful steps on his pilgrim way. Here they are:

The Agony in the Garden – Talk about isolated! Jesus is there by himself wrestling with a truly painful decision. The friends he asked to be alert on his behalf have fallen asleep. We often find ourselves in a similar spot, perhaps when we hear that dread word "Cancer" or when the doctor says "There's nothing we can do for Grandma." What do we do next? It's the same question Jesus is asking his Father.

The Scourging at the Pillar – I suppose all of us have childhood memories of getting caught for something we didn't do, usually because an older sibling or bully at school "turns us in." It can happen in adulthood when we're wrongly accused of something, perhaps by a neighbor, fellow worker or even a total stranger. Jesus himself commented elsewhere in his ministry how to get beyond these moments of sorrow: Perseverance.

The Crowning with Thorns – Although this was a physical moment for Jesus, the experiences in our lives often lead to intense mental anguish or sorrow, a pain within the mind that parallels the pain in Jesus' scalp as the thorns dig deep. We might pause in our reflection to consider those sad thoughts about which we can't really do much at the time but toss and turn in bed, pace the room but can't seem to rid ourselves of the thoughts.

Carrying the Cross – Burdens of all sorts can weigh us down: mentally, spiritually, emotionally, psychologically and even physically as the wood did to Jesus. These burdens lead to intense sadness or sorrow, especially when they seem to have no end in sight. There are many examples: perhaps the mother whose child has senselessly used a gun to commit a killing, a child whose parents constantly fight and argue, a neighbor who has to put up with our loud parties every weekend, a teacher who finds the parents worse to deal with than the unruly child.

As you pray the Sorrowful Mysteries, take time to consider the human experience each evokes in your own life and join Jesus in the deepest sadness and sorrow of his life.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
