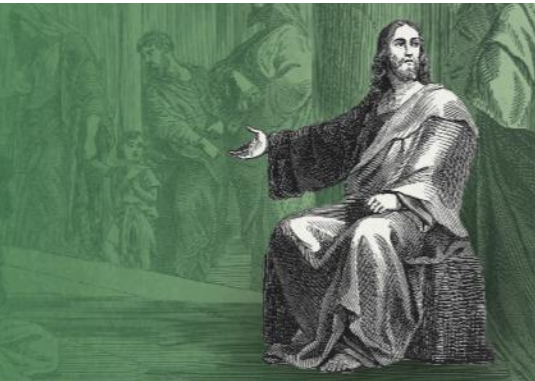

Dear People of God,

A couple of weeks ago I began a series on the good old subjects of the good old pastor's good old sermons. As promised, today follows up on the subject of hell. I mentioned that hell is real and is a condition of being lost in the endless dark of nothingness. Nothing good can exist in this state so consider what that must be like. I recall from those good old days a TV show which is experiencing a new life, *Hawaii 5-0*. Back then there was a master criminal, Wo Fat, who was always up to no good in an attempt to do in the show's hero. In one memorable episode, he captured the hero and put him in a tank which deprived him of all five senses: nothing to see because it was dark, nothing to hear because it was a sealed container, nothing to feel because he was suspended in water, nothing to smell, nothing to taste. The idea was to make him go incurably insane. Today small doses of deprivation seem beneficial but think about prolonged exposure to nothing. I'd get bored pretty quickly and think of all the things I ought to be doing, none of which can be done in that environment. I'd get frustrated not getting things done, and then angry because I can't do anything anyway. Not for me!

So, how does one get to hell? Thankfully, it isn't easy, or at least not for a person of even minimal faith. To understand this, we have to take up another famous old topic rarely mentioned today: Mortal Sin. As the name suggests (you can look up mortal sinfulness in the *Catechism*, paragraph 1861), it's deadly. It's deadly in the sense that it entirely destroys relationships. That can be on several levels parallel to the Great Command to love God, neighbor and self. A sinful act can totally destroy our relationship with God. It can also entirely destroy our relationship to a neighbor or a lot of neighbors. A real mortal sin also destroys the interior relationship of love we ought to have for ourselves.

Let's amplify those three levels a bit. We begin by reminding ourselves that sin is the deliberate performance of an act which is in and of itself wrong or evil. There's a lot to unpack there. *Deliberate* means it isn't an accident. It's something we (a) know to be wrong and (b) choose to do anyway regardless of the damage which results to our relationships. *Performance* means we actually do what we have deliberated, knowing it's wrong. An *act* means there is actually some process of action, whether in thought, word or deed. Actions can be a little wrong, like borrowing that dime from Mom's coin purse when we were eight and really, really needed that Hershey Bar. It can also be terribly wrong, like when one uses a Samurai sword to decapitate somebody at the dog park for not cleaning up after Fido. Sin has a vast range of seriousness depending on who sins, what action is taken and what damage accrues.

Understanding mortal sin, clearly the most serious of sinful transgressions, is integral to understanding hell, a connection we will consider next week.

### **The Celebration of Sacraments**

**Infant Baptism:** The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults:** RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. **Penance:** The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony:** Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

**Pastoral Care of the Sick:** When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

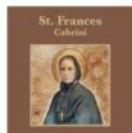
## Saints Peter and Paul

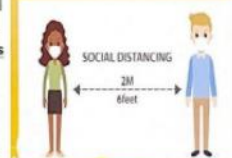
