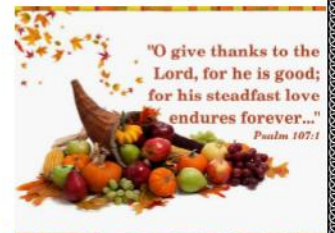
Dear People of God,

I began a series on hell and sin but allow me to interrupt it to mention both the Solemnity of Christ, King of the Universe and Thanksgiving later this same week. Throughout the letters of St. Paul, we read that we are, by virtue of baptism, children of God whose "citizenship is in heaven." The last Sunday in the Liturgical year comments on how that citizenship functions. Christ is the one and only "head of state" who governs as a benevolent and compassionate king. His kingdom is not like earthly kingdoms with which we might be familiar because in most of those, there's the royal family and then everybody else. In Christ's kingdom we're all part of the royal family just because we're God's adopted children, the Body of Christ. That means, as is so often the case, that the Solemnity isn't just about Jesus; it's about us and the exalted place God is holding in reserve for us when we transition from this life to the next. That's why the Church expects us to be in the praying community on all of the great Solemnities - we're in a sense celebrating ourselves or at least our future selves if we make the grade and get into heaven.

That, then leads me to Thanksgiving. It's a secular holiday with deep religious undertones, dating to an era when the United States felt its roots arising from a fertile religious ground that admitted not only the existence of a loving God but the favor of that God and colonies established on our shores and then on the national experiment conceived by the founders of the United States. There is, despite all of the contemporary issues challenging that national experiment, much for which to give thanks. Yes, gas is expensive but we are blessed with our lives, waking up each day to, hopefully, give thanks to God who awakened us. Yes, the cost of our turkey dinner has gone up but we are blessed that family can gather to share family. Yes, crime is escalating but our faith community offers us the support of continuous prayer. Yes, COVID has caused innumerable problems but modern medicine has discovered miracles to deal with it.

I could go on about problematic issues and about blessings; however, the day is set aside for us to consider for ourselves what the blessings God has imparted to each of us might be. Rather than find reason to complain this Thursday, find reason to give thanks. The reasons are there if we pause to look for them, listen for them and otherwise attune ourselves to the wonders God bestows on his beloved. Turn off your phone and your TV for ten or fifteen minutes and just sit back quietly and discover your real blessings. When you have, rather than post a picture of the turkey and stuffing, post a message for others about what God has done for you. It's a great way to evangelize and perhaps assist others in discovering the blessings in their own lives. Have a truly warm, wonderful and blessed celebration!

### ***The Celebration of Sacraments***

**Infant Baptism:** The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults:** RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory at Historic St. Patrick @ 419-243-6452.

**Penance:** The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony:** Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

**Pastoral Care of the Sick:** When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

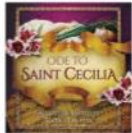
