Dear People of God,

Every now and again I'm asked about issues that don't appear in homilies the way they did in the good old days, hell and sin for instance, or other topics which are current but not often mentioned from the pulpit, abortion and violence for instance. As I've said before, the homily is supposed to reflect the readings and these don't often touch on issues which were central to the good old days. So I'll dedicate the next several letters to comment on some of those hot button items with a couple of other topical issues added here and there along the way.

Here's a topical item: *Living Christ.* The diocesan-wide capital campaign is currently in phase two, we're part of it and will be actively soliciting your generosity through the end of the liturgical year. The Campaign is focused on establishing a number of endowments which will provide ongoing funding for many of the ministries which the Diocese wants to provide for all of us. I've mentioned them in previous letters so won't repeat myself today; however, I want to provide an update for all of us so we can, in a sense, pat ourselves on the back for the great effort put forth so far. As of last Thursday (the weekly reporting deadline) when the first part of the in-parish campaign informally ended, the diocese had pledged or donated 70% of the goal of \$65,000,000. Here at the parish we've pledged or donated 48% of our goal of \$145,000.00. Reaching our diocesan goal will enable us to keep \$50,750.00 here in the parish to be channeled toward much needed work projects. I offer thanks to all who have brought us to this point and challenge everyone to make a sacrificial offering at whatever level you might in prayer decide is adequate to your means.

Now for a quick look at hell. Hell is real but we shouldn't think of it so much as a place as a condition of being deprived forever of the goodness of God. Think what that means in the practical sense of what we already know of God's goodness. His first act of good for you and me was the effects of the words: *let there be light*. Thus hell is a condition of being in which there is no light, just eternal, impenetrable darkness. And if there's no light, there's no sun or moon or stars, no clouds or sky nor rain or solid earth on which to stand. There's no pumpkin spice latte because there's no pumpkin patch or spice plants. Nor is there water or milk for that latte. There's nothing from the created order because all that is has been created by God for goodness. Hell is a vast nothingness: no sight or sound, an emptiness of the soul, of the self and of all that surrounds anyone who is foolish enough to "go to hell." Perhaps our fear of the dark is a God-given sense to fear hell and all it stands for.

Given the goodness and love of God for us, hell is a difficult concept to apply to our relationship to the Father. This idea of "darkness" starts our contemplation of hell which will be further addressed in a future letter.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
