Dear People of God,

We recently began an in depth tour of the depths of hell according to the famous poem Inferno by Dante, an Italian writer. It's well worth reading even today and rings some very familiar tones we can hear reverberating in our own society. Last week we entered the gates of hell through Limbo. Please don't confuse Limbo with Purgatory. The latter is the waiting room for full admittance to heaven while Limbo had no exit door.

Just below Limbo was the formal Gate of Hell. Here the sinner encountered Minos, the judge of the underworld to whom each sinner had to make a full confession and thereby condemn themselves to the level where they would spend eternity. It was not, just as the Church has consistently taught, God who sent them to hell but their own choice to sin when they knew better.

The first real circle of hell was the Circle of Lust. This was the first level which included a formal species of punishment where those who caved in to physical appetites were condemned to be blown hither and thither by a relentless, aimless wind. Never setting foot on solid ground, they were punished by being deprived of roots, family, culture, society, anything good. Note that as we pointed out a few weeks ago, the punishment isn't being poked by Satan's pitchfork but is the absence of the very things genuine love ought to provide for us. Dante mentions a few famous lovers whose affairs ruined their own lives (e.g. Lancelot and Guinevere), ruined the lives of others and even ruined whole nations by their dalliances. He makes the point that lust often involves others than the lovers who are drawn into committing their own sins as a direct result of what the lovers have done. It's an unhappy circle where a distorted sense of love leads to nothing. We ought to be able to envision just how this all works itself out in our own time by looking around.

Our dive deeper into hell will continue as we follow Virgil and Dante further into the pits of hell.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Health News for January 22, 2023

Drawbacks of concierge medicine: The trend toward concierge medicine has also raised concerns about its potential negative impact on patients, doctors, and the healthcare industry overall.

For patients: Some potential drawbacks of concierge medicine for health consumers may be:

- You pay higher out-of-pocket costs. •
- You still need some kind of health insurance. •
- According to a position statement from the American College of Physicians (ACP), existing research does not show that a longer visit with your doctor ensures better care or better health outcomes.

Because physicians see fewer patients, you may not be able to find a concierge practice accepting new patients.

Some people, including physicians contributing to the ACP statement, fear that concierge medicine worsens healthcare inequity for people with low income or chronic diseases.

Historic South Initiative Home Repair Program

Historic South Initiative's home repair program helps residents in the Old South End repair issues to the outside of their home that are related to lead hazards, safety, and sanitation. The following repairs qualify:

- -New windows and/or doors
- -New siding and/or painting
- -Roof repair and/or replacement
- -Gutter replacement
- -Exterior asbestos removal

Once an application is received and approved, Historic South will inspect the home and determine what can be done. A grant to the resident is then awarded based on income. The average grant is \$15,000.

To qualify, you must meet these requirements:

- Be in the target area of I-75 highway to Broadway to Walbridge Ave, back to I-75.
- Be the owner of the property.
- Be current on home taxes. If not current, must make a down payment towards a payment plan and pay up to 3 months before being eligible.
- House having a sound structural quality.
