Dear People of God,

Just before Christmas we concluded the Living Christ Capital Campaign for our wave of about a third of the diocese's 103 parishes. Our goal, like that of every parish, was 150% of the annual Sunday collection averaged over the past three years. The idea behind the three-year average was to reflect the lower income being generated as parish numbers decline. That led to a goal of \$146,000. Sadly, in an aging parish with many on a fixed income and others experiencing the effects of inflation, there was little support shown for this campaign, no volunteers to do a few visits to explain the campaign, and few participating families. Nevertheless, the small minority of those who pledged raised our total for the campaign to a respectable 71% of the goal. These families who are making the effort to assist in the ministry of the diocese are to be thanked for their generosity and sacrifice.

Our in-parish goal was to raise enough to accomplish three projects: (1) an ADA compliant ramp to the sanctuary level via the office door, (2) repair to several broken art glass panels and (3) preliminary engineering for the Broadway extension of the parking lot. Thanks to an anonymous gift received for the first two projects, they can be completed; however, the engineering study, like so much else here at Immaculate Conception, will have to wait.

Finances are a consistent issue here and have been from the beginning. As in most Catholic parishes, about 10% of the families support 90% of the expenses to maintain the buildings, underwrite the ministries and otherwise pay the bills. That's quite a burden to expect from those generous families. This isn't the effect of being a small, poor parish because it's true of the biggest and weal thiest Catholic parishes as well. For some reason Catholics, who are in other respects very generous, are among the lowest ranking churches in terms of the Sunday offering. When averaged out among those making an offering, Catholic weekly financial support is about 2-3% per family. That's almost 10% below the next lowest church. I'm not sure why this is the case, but sadly it is. Too many take advantage of what the church offers without helping with the bills.

All of us ought to pray about that situation because, as the old preacher once said: "Good news! All our financial woes are resolved. There's money for everything. Bad news! It's in your pocketbooks." As we approach the time of year when finances become really tight, please consider what you can do to help, especially if you're currently doing nothing.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.



* Snow Emergency *

Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a Level 3 Snow Emergency during which all roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio or internet, making a spiritual Communion. When Mass is cancelled, all other diocesan, parish, or school events in the geographic area are also cancelled.



Historic South Initiative Home Repair Program

Historic South Initiative's home repair program helps residents in the Old South End repair issues to the outside of their home that are related to lead hazards, safety, and sanitation. The following repairs qualify:

- -New windows and/or doors
- -New siding and/or painting
- -Roof repair and/or replacement
- -Gutter replacement
- -Exterior asbestos removal

Once an application is received and approved, Historic South will inspect the home and determine what can be done. A grant to the resident is then awarded based on income. The average grant is \$15,000.

To qualify, you must meet these requirements:

- Be in the target area of I-75 highway to Broadway to Walbridge Ave, back to I-75.
- Be the owner of the property.
- Be current on home taxes. If not current, must make a down payment towards a payment plan and pay up to 3 months before being eligible.
- House having a sound structural quality.
