Dear People of God,

It seems a long time ago that I began a series on a topic someone said needed more attention from the Church: hell. Hell is real and is the eternal destination for those who sin gravely against God and God's creation. It is the deprivation of all that is good, a severe, lonely, arid waste. Again, it's real and over the centuries many have attempted to glean some sense of what all that means. For many ancient civilizations the underworld was dark, filled with monsters eager to devour anyone foolish enough to go there. Among the more famous authors who delved into the topic was Dante Alighieri, the Italian poet/author whose work The Divine Comedy includes a lengthy section devoted to the levels of hell to which particular sinners are destined by those sins.

After introducing the idea of Limbo, the following levels all deal with actions which go beyond ordinary human behavior, sins of excess and self-absorption. We've looked at the first levels in previous letters (Lust, Gluttony and Greed) so let's descend now to level five which is reserved for Wrath.

As with the previous levels, this one is marked by both commission (hateful angry acts) and omission (harboring hateful, angry thoughts). Dante uses the old Roman notion of the river Styx which formed the barrier between life and death in Roman mythology. However, for Dante the river is shallow, slimy and foul. Those who hated and gave in to anger in life struggle at the surface of this morass to endlessly wrangle with one another in an eternal pointless battle without purpose or limit. Dante again names a few names of people whose temper got the best of them in life and are now destined to deal with that temper forever. At this level it is hopelessness which is the burning flame that perpetually afflicts the doomed sinner.

Of course, the slime can accommodate those who harbored evil thoughts but never acted on them (omission): they can be found deep in the sloppy goop of the Styx, unable to move or function. These sinners are held captive by their inability to surface the interior anger that wraps them completely. Not only is this crowd hopeless, having no means of escaping the condition for which they are being punished, but the inner forces of their sins constantly threaten to consume them. Anger that eats away at the soul is the sin which leads to this state.

Lust, Gluttony, Greed and Wrath are all behaviors which, as Dante repeatedly states, are taking the good and making it evil by hoarding it to oneself at an extreme level. He will now enter into a different realm of the circles of hell, sins which are not ordinary human behaviors. He believes these are far more difficult to commit and are therefore far more harmful to the sinner and the society in which these sins are committed. In fact, the lower levels are separated from the ones we've seen so far because the sins and the punishments are themselves extraordinary. We'll look at them as we continue our descent into the pits of hell.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.





Health News for February 26, 2023

Keep Your Eyes Healthy: Protect your eyes. Every day, you can take simple steps to keep your eyes healthy. Use these tips to protect your eyes from things that can harm them:

- Wear sunglasses. Protect your eyes from the sun by • wearing sunglasses — even on cloudy days! Be sure to look for sunglasses that block 99 to 100 percent of both UVA and UVB radiation.
- Wear protective eyewear. Safety glasses and goggles are designed to protect your eyes during certain activities, like playing sports, doing construction work, or doing home repairs. You can buy them from most eye care providers and some sporting goods stores.
- Give your eyes a rest. Looking at a computer for a long time can tire out your eyes. Rest your eyes by taking a break every 20 minutes to look at something about 20 feet away for 20 seconds.
- If you wear contacts, take steps to prevent eye in-• fections. Always wash your hands before you put your contact lenses in or take them out. Be sure to disinfect your contact lenses and replace them regularly.


