Dear People of God,

Last week I expanded on low Mass attendance. As baptized into the Christ, we have certain obligations (what we must do – we have no choice because of the relationship formed between each of us and God at baptism) toward God and his Church as committed Christians and even more as committed Catholics. These are normally defined as time, talent and treasure. I devoted almost all of a previous week's letter to what time means from a Christian perspective and concluded with an introduction to this week's focus: Why do people give so little of their time to God?

I'm a big fan of the Harry Potter series. The vocabulary is excellent and the author's knowledge of religion and history is equally so. In fact, many of the people we encountered on our recent journey through Dante's Inferno made their way to the pages of her works as the arch villains of the story of good versus evil. Her knowledge of Christian philosophy is included in those same pages. Like Aristotle, Aquinas, Whitehead, Merleau-Ponty, St. John Paul II and a host of others up to our modern era (I'm dropping a few names in hopes you might research them and discover a lot about human behaviors), she has some wonderfully descriptive things to say about time, how it rushes now and snail-paces then, how we're allotted just so much of it (a biblical topic you can find in Ecclesiastes) and how one ought to be using it. I find it both delightfully apt and magnificently laid out.

Rowling believes, as do most of the philosophers who examine time and our use of it, that most humans waste it; they fail to appreciate how little we really have so don't invest wisely in its use throughout our brief - when compared to either geological time or the eternity of the Kingdom - life. Most people never stop to think of time as a valuable reality given by God to be stewarded – think of the King who gave three men a number of coins to invest while he was gone (time). In large part wasting time is one of the unintended consequences of the sin of Adam and it continues to be a major temptation to sin today.

So, why do we waste time? Among the many reasons and on the top of my list is our secular entitlement culture. In the good old days before the Internet, Social Media, video games, organized athletics, etc., people were what Teddy Roosevelt called rugged individuals toiling for the good of all. Historically that began to change during the Great Depression when the government stepped in and provided work opportunities for millions (the CCC and WPA for example). Unfortunately, it didn't stop there. Any number of entitlements sprang up which relieved the necessity of rugged individualism and toil for the common good. Increasingly a lot of people fell into the trap of arrogance, pride and the expectation that the world owed them a living rather than they owing anyone or the world anything or even the necessity to earn the living they desired.

We can see this all around us today, exacerbated by the recent pandemic, and it's one reason people have fallen away from the Church – they believe that God owes them and what do they get from him at Mass? Of course, there's another problem in that question – a failure to appreciate the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist – the free will gift of a loving God to all who participate. If, as the late Andrew Greely (a priest of the Chicago diocese and a degreed sociologist) discovered, two-thirds of the people at Mass don't believe Jesus is truly present, then we have a real problem and a real cause for fewer people coming to Mass. Coupled to entitlement, a lack of faith explains a lot about those empty pews and closed parishes.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Health News for May 7, 2023

What is Metabolic Syndrome? Metabolic syndrome is a group of five risk factors that can lead to heart disease, diabetes, stroke and other health problems. Metabolic syndrome is diagnosed when someone has three or more of these conditions:

- High blood glucose (sugar)
- Low levels of HDL ("good") cholesterol in the blood
- High levels of triglycerides in the blood
- Large waist circumference or "apple-shaped" body
- High blood pressure

Although each of these is a risk factor for cardiovascular disease, when a person has three or more and is diagnosed with metabolic syndrome, it increases the chance of developing a serious cardiovascular condition. **Source:** American Heart Association
