Dear People of God,

Last week I ended up in a dying Roman empire but I want to make it clear that contemporary states can suffer the same fate. It's what we see happening to our parishes and Churches. Entitlement shows up in many ways at the parish and this can be discerned in how much of the people's time, talent and treasure are being devoted to the parish, whether ours or anyone else's.

Time means a lot more than Mass. Parishes regularly invite members to participate in other prayer times and activities which include weekday Masses, Eucharistic Adoration, Bible Study, enrichment programs, volunteer organizations which seek to render aid to the needy (spiritual, physical and sometimes mental), ministries around the parish, fund raising events, outreach, hospital visitation and others. At home some of our time should be spent in spiritual formation: reading, prayer and other forms of personal enlightenment and growth.

For the entitled, time is theirs, greedily hoarded for personal or individual pursuits which they believe gives them a return on time spent. Thus, attention is given to activities which may or may not enrich the entitled person (they will always say that these activities are enriching while many are often quite the opposite) and which impinge upon the time they could be spending in spiritual matters.

From my perspective one of the technological wonders which has most degraded people's sharing of their time with others in a constructive way is the cell phone. Far too many people can barely keep their phone out of their hands and will often pick it up in the middle of a conversation or the middle of a dinner at a fine restaurant to attend to something on the phone rather than the people with whom they ought to be sharing their time. Among the least attractive applications of the cell phone in my estimation is texting. I've seen families at the restaurant, all of them on their phone tapping away to somebody, perhaps one another or a "friend" elsewhere, while neglecting the human interaction a meal should be providing. I was at one of our downtown places and actually saw a team of athletes come in and not once say a word to anyone as the blue glow of cell phones suffused their faces. An entire meal without conversation beyond calling for a refill of our beverage of choice is a real waste of precious time.

Far too much of our modern technology tends to fuel entitlement and develop other behaviors which are averse to what Church should be, leading to people not coming, not because they choose to avoid Church but because they have created a bad habit of allotting their time to all the wrong places.

Time is limited and all of us wish we had more; few of us have taken the time to budget ourselves so we have the time for important things, like our relationship with God and God's community of believers. Perhaps all of us could benefit from such a budgeting attempt.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call the church @ 419-243-1829.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.



Health News for May 21, 2023

How is Metabolic Syndrome Diagnosed? Most of the conditions that make up metabolic syndrome have no signs or symptoms. But a large waistline is a visible sign of being overweight or obese. You are diagnosed with metabolic syndrome if you have three or more of these conditions:

- Central or abdominal obesity. This is measured by waist circumference: Men: greater than 40 inches, Women: greater than 35 inches
- High triglycerides: 150 mg/dL or more, or you're taking medicine for high triglycerides
- Low HDL cholesterol, or you're taking medicine for low HDL cholesterol: Men: Less than 40 mg/dL, Women: Less than 50 mg/dL
- High blood pressure: 130/85 mmHg or more, or you're taking medicine for high blood pressure
- High fasting glucose (blood sugar): 100 mg/dL or more, or you're taking medicine for high blood glucose




Pentecost | Sacred Art


