Dear People of God,

The last couple of weeks I've been looking at the question: Why don't people come to Mass? To answer that, I've looked at the requirements of being a member of any Church, whether it be Catholic or any other. Reduced to a few simple terms, those obligations are to give to God a fair measure of our time, our talent and our treasure. Having looked at time, let me turn to talent.

Talents are those particular good behaviors at which we excel. Things like painting, archery, bowling, cooking and other similar activities might come to mind; however, all of us have other talents which are wonderfully suited to the glorification of God. We refer to these as Ministerial energies. Singing is perhaps one of the talents many have been given but few offer to God as a gift. In fact, the entire realm of music should provide a wealth of talent for the Church but it's one of the most difficult areas to realize. Many Catholics were in the high school chorale, sang in the class play, or played in the band or orchestra yet we rarely see or hear any of that talent brought into God's house where those talented individuals could so easily give glory to God. For some it's easy and quick to complain that the choir is small, the music weak or whatever the individual believes doesn't fit his or her own expectations, but those same complainers do nothing to become part of the so-called Music Ministry. It's the same with other aspects of parish life as well. Entitled people are quick to complain and rarely offer to do anything to resolve their complaints.

Everyone has been given numerous talents which could be shared with the Church. Some are great at sharing visions and ideas which could be put to good effect to assist in leading a Bible study or pitching ads for a program. Others have great talents for speaking and holding others' attention which could be put to good effect in teaching CCD or RCIA or some other adult education class.

Some have been given the talent to steward resources which could so easily be used for the Church's fund raising efforts. Others have the talent that allows them to get up in front of a crowd and not tremble; these folks could easily lend that talent to being lectors or Eucharistic Ministers, adult ed teachers, RCIA presenters and more.

Following the Second Vatican Council when the Church opened itself to non-ordained men and women doing so much in the Church, there was a flood of people anxious to become involved. In more recent times the flow has come to a near stop. In part that's the consequence of the decline in time devoted to God and God's work. People don't have time for the choir, for Bible Study, for lectoring, or for any of the other ministries perfect for their talents. But it's also a consequence of an entitlement mentality. Far too many people expect that the Church owes them and they owe nothing beyond, maybe, showing up in the pew now and again. In a former assignment I and several other pastors did a huge survey and discovered that while weekly attendance hovered around 30% of the membership of our parishes, well over eighty percent were coming although not regularly. Some came on Christmas and Easter, others once a month, some weekly, as if membership was a "pick and choose" sort of thing. The 30% included different people each week, but 30% of those registered falls far short of meeting the needs for parish ministries, offices and volunteer programs. The 30% grow weary, are burned out, and even they begin to drift away.

We ought to give serious consideration to our own talents and find ways and means to share some of those with our loving and generous God. If we don't, then we can expect Mass attendance to decline even further and when the parish closes, expect those who offered nothing of their talent to complain. Contributing your talents is one way of expressing your hope that we remain a viable and meaningful parish.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call the church @ 419-243-1829.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.


