Dear People of God,

I hope to conclude my series on time, talent and treasure today so let's see how well I can draw things to a conclusion.

I've been discussing the three duties of the good Christian through the lens of entitlement and I'd like to do that with our sense of sharing treasure with the Church and for that matter any other charity. Entitlement always puts the me ahead of the us and well ahead of them. Allow me to share an example.

The parish stands in need of a new boiler so has planned a "Major Fund Raiser" which will feature a dinner and a silent auction. Envelopes will be placed on the tables seeking donations from the people attending. The silent auction includes a number of items, all of which have a value listed. Enter the entitlement mentality. Entitled guests paid for a dinner so those envelopes on the table go unused; after all, didn't the guests fork out for the dinner? The silent auction has a trip to Bimini aboard the Minnow valued at four thousand, eight hundred dollars. Enter the entitlement mentality. The vacation, for which the parish paid half, brought in a whopping \$1875.00.

That's the fate of most Catholic and many other charitable fund raisers. Guests forget that the whole idea is to raise funds, not lose them. To entice people to the silent auction, that dinner may have cost the parish the entire ticket price asked from the guests. No funds raised. And when we're talking fund raising, the stated value of an auction item should be the starting point of the bidding. The idea is not to find a deal but to help raise funds.

When the parish was founded, there was a custom to hold an annual "flour auction." The five-pound sack of flour was donated by the mill and at the auction, the winner immediately donated it back and this went on until everyone present had purchased the flour which was then donated to the organization for its use. Fund raising raised funds.

Today an entitlement mentality too often leads people to expect a deal and they will not seriously work to make the fund raiser raise funds. Rather, they complain that they weren't able to "get a deal" on that motor scooter in the silent auction! Not only do they complain, but few of them bothered to go out and find a few other donated items which might have helped raise the funds for which the fund raiser was developed.

I was at an art auction some years ago where the overall value of the art works donated by local artists was around \$15,000. The entitlement mentality brought in a lot of people looking for a deal. I put in a few bids and "won" everything because few understood that the whole idea was to realize at least \$15,000 and perhaps twice that, thanks to generosity. Needless to say the artists were not pleased, there was no second art auction and the organization which needed the funds had to settle for far less than was needed for their worthy projects.

When it comes to a parish and its monetary good health, there is no poison worse than the entitlement mentality. It robs the parish of much needed regular income, reduces the opportunities for ministry and can actually lead to the parish closing its doors when the bills become overwhelming. Each one of us should do what we can to share time, talent and treasure with our parish and with our community. That's what social really means.

The Celebration of Sacraments

<u>Pastoral Care of the Sick</u>: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.


What to Do When Your Medication Is Not Covered: Reconsider your health plan during an enrollment period. If you notice that your plan no longer covers your prescription medication, find a plan that has the medication on its formulary. If you are enrolling in original Medicare or a Medicare Advantage plan, be sure to use the Medicare Plan Finder tool to identify the Medicare Part D prescription drug plan that covers the medication you need. How to file an appeal for prescription drug coverage. If you have explored other options for lowering your prescription costs with no luck, you can file and internal appeal with your insurance plan. The exact process will depend on your insurer, but often requires that you: Complete all forms required by the insurance plan. Submit any information you want considered, such as a letter from your doctor explaining that the medication is medically necessary.

If you need help, contact the consumer assistance program in your state. If you are enrolled in Medicare, you can also get free help from a State Health Insurance Assistance Program (SHIP) near you. **Source:** GoodRx.com, written by Tamara E. 


