Dear People of God,

I heard straight away from people about closing parish doors so I thought I'd take a quick look at why parishes do shutter their doors. There is no single reason but here are a few and often its the constellation of these working together that requires a parish to close.

Upward Mobility – Most parishes were established to meet the needs of a community with a large Catholic population. Living the American Dream, the Catholic families which organized the parish wanted the best for their children so made sure to see them off to either a great job or college. As those children came of age and wanted to start their own families, there was no room in the community so they moved on, building new communities where new parishes were established. Mom and Dad grew old and decided Florida was a far better place to live than Toledo so they too moved on. Suddenly the community had no or far fewer Catholics who could afford to support the ordinary operational needs of the parish. Here in Toledo we can see the effects of this on any number of our traditional old parishes which have been forced to shut down altogether.

Changing Demographics – This is in some sense associated with the above. As the Catholic community moves up the economic ladder, other groups move in. Often these are not Catholic so have little need for the Catholic church. While there's an exciting opportunity to reach out and evangelize, that opportunity to evangelize is never invoked as the shrinking Catholic community still present hunkers down to protect its identity. Whether by choice or by accident, the refusal to make welcome and invite has been the tolling of the death knell for a number of parishes.

Lurking in both of the above is the reality of an aging membership. As the parish grows older, its sources of income dwindle, especially when the people still present are on a fixed income resulting from retirement programs which were increasingly inadequate to provide a wholesome income as costs increased. Fixed income means a fixed income for the parish and most of these are the older places with anything but fixed expenses for maintenance and repairs. And in aging parishes, membership also faces the serious issue of members moving on to the Kingdom.

In the end, parishes close because there's nobody there, or not enough people to maintain the parish as a viable source of the Good News outside its doors. I recall one of our diocesan priests asked to return for a farewell Mass at a parish about to close. In his homily he asked a question and provided an answer. Where have you been? And Had you been here, this place would still be open.

The demise of any parish is rarely due to the diocese making a unilateral decision; it's a reflection of a decision made by the parish itself. Since we didn't build our churches on wheels so cannot move them to where the Catholic population is now living, parishes need to be attentive to invitation, to welcome, to vibrant RCIA programs and offering a variety of educational processes which entice people and families to come in the doors and hopefully remain. This cannot happen where a parish has fallen into protective mode, as if it were going to survive without any solid growth. It can only be prevented by a concerted effort to find ways and means to sustain what is present and regularly add to it in terms of what the parish is doing and the people who are doing it. In the end, a parish is only as strong as its people and where there are few or no people, or where the people are uninvolved and expect to be served rather than to serve, that parish is doomed.

A living parish shares the time, talent and treasure of its members both inside and outside the doors. It is that dynamic which best preserves the parish for the future and guarantees its sustainability.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call the church @ 419-243-1829.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
