Dear People of God,

Last week I began a series on the so-called arguments in favor of abortion. I will continue today by expanding a bit on rights since most of the arguments proposed to support abortion are called rights. Allow me, then, to return to the very notion of a right, a real one, not one confected in the mind of a human who wants something and seeks to justify it (what we used to call "rationalization" when I went to school).

A right is universal; everyone has it because it's a constituent part of being a human person. Our founders articulated this in the Declaration of Independence as "all men are endowed by their creator with certain inalienable rights." That generation understood that humanity differs from all else in creation because it has been crafted by God to be composed of those rights along with everything else we humans are. Note that although all of the founders were deeply religious (most belonged to the Church of England and were weekly attendees at services), they understood that religion differs among God's created people; thus they did not use the terms God or Jesus of Christ, but "their creator" to include whatever divine force any Americans might claim as their creator.

The founders also recognized that the real rights cannot be taken away without destroying the human person – the term inalienable. We have real rights because we're human, not because somebody gave them to us by means of a law or constitution. The founders recognized only a few real rights and named them "life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness" but admitted there were others associated with each of those named. For example, the primary right to life includes the right to air, water, food, housing, education and all the things necessary to stay alive. The founders understood that while the right cannot be taken away, it must also be exercised with proper respect for the same right in any other human person (which is what the remainder of the Declaration is all about – King George unlawfully/immorally preventing the colonists access to the full scope of the associated rights to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness).

However, the founders also realized that ordinary rights were often constrained or limited in their exercise which is why they wrote and adopted the Articles of Confederation and then the Constitution of the United States. If you look at the preamble to the Constitution, you'll discover why rights are limited in their exercise: "We the People of the United States, in Order to form a more perfect Union, establish Justice, insure domestic Tranquility, provide for the common defense, promote the general Welfare, and secure the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our Posterity, do ordain and establish this Constitution for the United States..."

There's a lot packed into that statement: it outlines the basic blueprint for limiting the exercise of some rights because there are a lot of us here and we all need to work together to assure the maximum capacity to exercise the real rights God gave us without doing harm to anyone else attempting to make use of those same rights. It's called society or culture or government but it means we willingly agree to constrain the exercise of some rights in respect of the goals stated in the preamble. We recognize that exercising rights often involves limiting our behavior, a necessity we will explore next week.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
