Dear People of God,

I've been touching on the arguments in favor of abortion on demand and why the so-called argument of some preeminent reproductive right is specious (full of holes). The reproductive right is human intercourse and if we choose to exercise the right, we may well encounter the rather common consequence of having used the right: a conception and pregnancy. The conception and pregnancy are not the right; they are the result of using it. Because pregnancy entails the presence of another human person with the same rights any of us has (life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness and the reproductive right we have been discussing) we may discover that there are obligations toward that other human person. The so-called argument of reproductive right is usually raised up in order to avoid the consequences of having exercised the right.

We need to take a side trip here because many women who seek an abortion live in circumstances which make them leery or afraid to take on the obligations because they can't. Poverty, homelessness and other conditions of life are such that these women simply cannot afford a child or don't want to bring one into the same situation of no job, no income and poor housing. We might respond that they shouldn't be exercising the reproductive right but our culture resists any real effort, legal or religious, to constrain the exercise of that right, particularly by far too many men who inveigle woman into the back seat of the '57 Chevy and can conveniently provide the mechanism for avoiding either the consequences or the obligations.

Sadly, the entitlement culture also tends to provide impetus for avoiding the consequences and obligations of using the reproductive right. The entitled will say they have a right to the great good feelings aroused but can easily get rid of any "leftovers" they don't want to deal with. It's obvious that the entitled do not consider any of the purposes outlined in the preamble (more than likely because they don't even know them) nor ask themselves or their partner how the exercise of the reproductive right tonight fulfills its goals to.

- form a more perfect Union,
- establish Justice,
- insure domestic Tranquility,
- provide for the common defense,
- promote the general Welfare,
- secure the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our Posterity

By the same token, most Christians rarely if ever consider the mandate of God to steward the created order when they elect to make use of the reproductive right or choose to disregard the expectation of the Church that they willingly accept the consequences and obligations which may result from the exercise of the right. We'll continue next Sunday as we shift the focus from rights to the pro-choice claim of self-determination and privacy regarding one's body.

The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Back to School Health Tips for Parents/Guardians. Tip Three: Make Sleep a Priority




