Dear People of God,

I'm pausing in the series currently under way to address a serious cancer not only for us here at Immaculate Conception but for just about every parish in Toledo and far beyond – the loss of members. I ran a series earlier this year on the reasons parishes close and most of them can be traced to reduced membership. It affects parishes rich and poor, large and small, old as the diocese and new as yesterday. As part of the Intentional Planning going on in the diocese and deanery, there is a significant focus on sustainability; for the most part that means attracting and keeping new families, single people and both the young and old. Over the years I've been here, many have defaulted to the excuse that we have no parking lot but that's not entirely reasonable. An active, well-organized parish would see people trekking blocks to be part of such a community of faith. How are we doing?

It's not enough to look at Sunday Mass to discern the active life of a parish, but what's going on during the week. How are we doing?

There's one weekday Mass: Tuesday morning at 9 during the summer months and 9:10 during the school year. How often do you attend? That's a good measure of the active life of the parish. During the school year it's a great way to affirm the faith dimension of the school and its student body. Seeing no one there does little to reassure the children that there is any reason for them to be there so we shouldn't blame them for not becoming part of our parish community.

We attempt to offer Bible study or some adult formation during the year. How often do you attend? An empty church with three or four people does little to send the message that we are a viable home for those looking for a parish family.

We provide the Stations of the Cross during Lent. How often do you attend?

We do our best to staff an Outreach Center. How often do you contribute to its work either by offering cash, goods or your time?

As we consider the sustainability of the parish, we should all consider how well we do our individual part to make the parish life-giving and supportive. An empty church is not inviting and does little to announce the loving presence of God in the community. Nor will it ever raise the necessary funds with which to buy adequate property to create a parking lot suitable to the needs of the parish. We are currently seeking men and women for the RCIA, both catechumens and parish members working with them. Are you willing to invite someone to come along with us and perhaps walk with them toward the Easter sacraments? Sustainability demands that each of us go out of our way to do the inviting and the walking or there will be little to sustain. Give it some serious and prayerful thought and then be just as willing to take action rather than wait for others to do it for you.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call the church @ 419-243-1829.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

<u>Pastoral Care of the Sick</u>: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.


Health News for September 10, 2023

Mammography Matters: Why Should I Get a Mammogram? Mammograms are the best primary way to screen for breast cancer. They can find breast lumps that are too small for a woman or her healthcare provider to feel. Mammograms cannot find all problems. Call your healthcare provider if you notice any change in your breasts such as: a lump, thickening of skin, liquid leaking from the nipple, changes in how the nipple or skin looks. When Should I Get a Mammogram? Regular screenings are important, and the risk of breast cancer varies by person. Ask your healthcare provider when and how often you should schedule a mammogram and what type of
