Dear People of God,

Last week, we opened our consideration of how the Bible came into being by examining the initial role of oral story telling and the likelihood that contact with other groups influenced each group's stories. As Israel grew and began to split into what we know as the Twelve Tribes, what was being shared was different for each tribal group because they were encountering different neighbors. Over many centuries these stories were codified by various tribal scribes into collections as writing was developed. The collections varied from tribe to tribe; over many more centuries they were shared and re-codified into larger collections with some material being lost due to migration, war, conquest and other forces applied to the tribes while other material made its way into a collection as two somewhat different stories, as occurred with the creation stories now included in Genesis. Consequently there are often conflicting or different versions of the same thing.

Of course, we know that the Holy Spirit had a significant hand in each stage of the development of the essential contents of what would become the Old Testament. The working of the Spirit is most evident in two features of the Bible: (1) the consistency of the overall narrative founded on the Great Commandment to Love God and love your neighbor as you love yourself, and (2) the complex interweaving of people and events in what we, four thousand years after the fact, might think unrelated. An example of this interrelatedness can be seen in the Abraham, Isaac and Jacob Abraham and Sara go to Egypt, stay at the Pharaoh's Court and return to Israel with the Egyptian servant girl narrative. Hagar. A close connection to the imperial court is forged. Getting older, Sara believes she can't have children so invokes an ancient tradition of having a servant girl take her place and Ishmael is born. Keep in mind that while legally he's Abraham's first born son, he's biologically half Egyptian and keep in that same mind those connections back to Egypt's royal court. When Sara and Abraham have another son on their own, Isaac, Sara wants to get rid of Ishmael so demands he be driven out into the desert where she hopes he'll die and there'll be no counterclaim when the will is read. Because Abraham knows that Ishmael is his first born, he asks God to watch over him and receives the promise that a "great nation" will spring from Ishmael. Remember that connection to the royal court back in Egypt because Abraham's great grandsons don't like their youngest brother Joseph and plan to do him in, but along comes a caravan of Ishmaelites on their way to the royal court of Egypt with trade goods essential to the eternal welfare of Pharaoh. Joseph is sold to his cousins and in Egypt is resold to Pharaoh's Captain of the Guard, putting him in the right palace at the right time to accomplish God's plan regarding Israel. It's an amazingly complex set of relationships that show the careful guidance of the Spirit in making the introduction of Exodus possible!

Until the time of the Roman Empire, there was no Old Testament as we know it because the tribal or regional collections, some of which still included a lot of oral stories never written down but told at family or community gatherings, ranged from those in the east to those off to the west in Spain and what is today France. The result was different texts in different places.

The fall of the Temple in 70 A.D. (an accident – the Romans wanted the space for a fortress but one of their soldiers accidentally set the place on fire and it was destroyed) sent a shock wave through the Jewish population wherever they lived (Christians were equally distraught since so many of them had been Jews). A number of learned scholars decided they better get together to make a more permanent, written collection that could be copied and distributed so that the priceless Word of God would not be lost as had happened with the collection of written scrolls held by the Temple in Jerusalem. Given the fact that the scholars would be working with diverse texts often with conflicting stories and drawn from wide-ranging tribal collections, the challenge of creating the desired permanent written collection was easier said than done as we shall start to see next week.

**Penance**: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony**: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

**Pastoral Care of the Sick**: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.


