"The kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people that will produce its fruit." *Matthew 21:43*

Dear People of God,

This weekend the Diocese celebrates its Patronal Feast Day (October 7), Our Lady of the Rosary. Here at the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary parish, we have a special connection to the Rosary. The twenty mysteries, while touching directly on the life and ministry of Jesus, involve in many ways his Mother, the Virgin Mary. Although the Immaculate Conception is not one of the twenty, the sinless conception of Mary is an intimate part of the story of our salvation in Jesus Christ.

From the moment when God promises Adam and Eve a savior, God is already preparing the world for an appropriate vessel for the Savior in which to be conceived and nourished until his birth. The privileged womb of Mary, which was to hold within it the divine substance of Jesus, had necessarily to be spared from any taint of Adam's sin. Mary was herself conceived set apart from the effects of Adam's fall.

Mary's Immaculate Conception prepared her to be far more than the bearer of the developing person of Jesus. Once he was born, her original sinlessness gave her the unique qualities of love of God, self and neighbor with which to expose the child Jesus to the very best in the human condition as he grew up and learned the ways of the world.

As members of a parish dedicated to the Immaculate Conception, we should all do our best to demonstrate to the world around us those same qualities of love of God, self and neighbor that Mary modeled for her divine son. Love of God should impel us to participate fully in the life of the parish, to celebrate Word and Sacrament with obvious joy, and then "go to all the world and proclaim the good news." Love of self should open us to the wonder of our humanity so that we treasure it and undertake all those activities which assure our good health physically, mentally and spiritually. Love of neighbor should create in us an intense regard for the needs and rights of others, even to the point of sacrificing our own goals for the good of the larger community around us.

During October, the month of the Rosary, we'll be reciting it each Saturday before Mass. Whether you come to pray with the parish or take up the beads on your own, reflect all this month on the mystery of God's love for you illustrated in the events of his life and that of his beloved mother. Take time to pray the rosary and perhaps gain a deeper understanding of how you can truly love your neighbor by imitating Jesus.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call the church @ 419-243-1829.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
