

Dear People of God,

Up to this point in our exploration of the creation of our Bible, the focus has been on oral stories and the crucial role of the written scrolls of The Old Testament. The early Churches relied extensively on the Old Testament writings available to them and would read and preach and teach from them; the role of Jesus was always central to how those texts were interpreted. Where there were a few of the original followers, the local church would listen to, memorize and then retell the important memories, especially what Jesus had to say since his words were the Word of God. As the old timers began to disappear (old age got more of them than any of the persecutions), the memories would become garbled, like the old game of telephone we used to play when we were in school. Ah, but remember, after destruction of the existing scrolls in 70 A.D, scholars efforts to recreate the content produced two strands of writings.

The problem with either of those two strands was that neither conveyed anything theologically sound about the "why and wherefore" of Jesus' saving acts; it was obvious that the love of God was entirely left out. This concerned the successors to the Apostles who wanted a pure line of content from Jesus to their communities. Because Jesus' words were God's Word, some of his sayings were committed to writing. One of those collections, written around the year 45 and credited to the Apostle Thomas, was widely circulated and was expanded by different local churches into narrative form – a story about Jesus addressing some specific need of the local church. The Gospel of Thomas was unknown to scholars from early times up to the discovery in the 1940's of a cache of Gnostic and early Christian materials from an ancient library at Nag Hamadi in Egypt, but even a cursory glance will suggest that many of the sayings of Jesus were incorporated from that collection into the gospels we all know.

Of course, four of those collections are Matthew, Mark, Luke and John but there were no doubt others, at least one of which is generally known to scholars although no written copy exists; large parts are included in one or several of the three similar or synoptic gospels: Matthew, Mark and Luke. Information about this text is in the Q Document on FORMED. Because the local church had limited access or unique access to some oral stories, the gospels, even those that are similar, all have some information not included in the others. Other than not having access to some bit of information, each of the authors also selected carefully from their sources to make the point he wanted for his local church. In other words, they chose not to include something some other author may have thought germane to his narrative.

It didn't take long by Roman standards for copies of these writings to find their way from whichever Church needed them to many other Churches which found them helpful in evangelizing the people. But along with them, all those other writings (Gnostic and speculative) were also being snapped up for the local collection. Keep in mind that unlike Hebraism, Christianity was a religion meant to be spread around; consequently by the end of the first century, hundreds of local churches had unique collections of what each considered sacred writings. There was plenty of overlap but just as much difference which caused regional gatherings of Churches to go through the various collections and trim them down to a list or "canon" of those books the gathering felt were "must reading." This pruning process was clearly a significant step in arriving at a shared and thus more-widely used common content. The Bible as we know it was taking shape.

Anyone who has served on a decision-making committee or has worked on a project with a group can understand the time it consumes and the give-and-take involved. Since the Bible is in its nascent stage, collaboration will necessarily continue and expand beyond individual regions.

The Celebration of Sacraments

The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.




