Dear People of God,

Over the period of his papacy, Francis has now and again addressed the mystery (and almost unknown practice here in the American Church) of Sacred Silence. I've addressed it myself several times from the pulpit but refer to it as a more practical sense of listening rather than speaking. Humans are rather poor at listening and when it comes to worship and prayer, that deficit seems all the more pronounced. Part of this is the way we've been taught to think and react. As soon as we hear a subject, an object, and a verb, our minds quickly make a logical sequence which all too often doesn't include the adjectives, adverbs and dependent clauses to say nothing of the split infinitives and dangling participles we tend to thrust into our spoken thoughts. The limited bits and pieces we hear spark an immediate response in the mind, one that doesn't necessarily have anything to do with what the speaker intended.

Knowing this dynamic, Francis has addressed the opportunity to hear God's words by recommending periods of sacred silence during the liturgy, especially following the lections for the day with these scriptural readings preceding the reception of the Eucharist. To some extent we do include periods of sacred silence; from the point of view available on the altar, it's easy to see how uncomfortable people are with those moments of quiet. For example, after the Presider proclaims "Let us Pray," the server is supposed to come over slowly enough that the people in the pew can actually think about what they should be praying for. We often do have an extended period of silence after Communion while the Ministers are taking care of the sacred vessels: it's an opportunity to hear Jesus within us, but these are often lost because liturgists and people believe everything should be either vocalized praying or singing. We lose the equally serious necessity of listening which is best offered by silence, the quiet of interior prayer and openness to God's presence.

We might give thought to how we can find silence in our lives away from Church where we can barely move without being accosted by some music, TV, video games, the cellphone ("No," texting isn't silence) and a host of other intrusive elements we encounter all through the day. The opportunity to hear God was considered of great value to the ancients; perhaps if we tried it on for size, we'd discover it's equally valuable to our current world.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office. **Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults:** RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Snow Emergency

Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a Level 3 Snow Emergency during which all roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio or internet, making a spiritual Communion. When Mass is cancelled, all other diocesan, parish, or school events in the geographic area are also cancelled.
