Dear People of God:

Despite the fact that we Catholics began our New Year four weeks ago on the 1st Sunday of Advent, Happy New Year!

For many New Year's Day is a meaningless celebration, just one day that flows after another and in the CFB (I think I got that right) a week before the real moment of glory when college football's National Championship is settled once and for all (at least until Tuesday when cares about who won become debates about who will win next year). Like much of our lives, the passage of time with the inevitable impact of completed events keeps altering our priorities. For example, don't you often wonder where all those people speeding past you on the road are going in such a hurry? Our culture seems to be going way too fast!

New Year's Day was – and for a few people still is – a chance to reflect on the previous twelve months and make some serious determinations about how one ought to comport him or herself in the twelve months ahead- what we used to call New Year's Resolutions. Today most of us are in too big a hurry to bother with thinking about the past, and as a result are doomed to repeat it. On the other hand, during the commercials of the Big Game or during the breaks in your post-holiday viewing, why not consider the year now turned to memory and dust? Give thought to how well you took care of your health and that of those you love. Think about the choices you made at the polls and whether they resulted in the good of the community and nation. Reflect on whether you made good use of your time to accomplish something of worth for yourself and others.

New Year's Day is the Church's official conclusion of Christmas Day, the Octave or eight days when we make note of the glorious birth of our savior. Before people began "voting with their feet" and skipped the celebration, the church would be packed with those still celebrating the wonder of the Christ Child and the immensity of the gift he represents in our lives. Many enjoy other secular aspects of New Year's Day; for example, when I lived in Texas we had more fireworks than on the 4th of July and when I was up in Ottawa doing doctoral studies, New Year's Day was pretty much spent on the Rideau Canal ice skating and stopping at all the hot chocolate stands and elephant ear shops that lined the 16 kilometer canal. When in Europe one winter for New Year's, I enjoyed my hot chocolate high above Innsbruck at the cocoa stand on the Hefelekar. Since many of you also savor some of the secular New Year's celebrations, consider posting your holiday destinations on the parish Facebook page so we can all share with you the adventure of travel. Do take time to bring the joy of Jesus into whatever you happen to be doing or wherever the holiday takes you. Jesus can be found everywhere and is always ready to join in on the excitement of our own lives.

Have a joy-filled day and may God walk with you through the year ahead.

The Celebration of Sacraments

<u>Infant Baptism</u>: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call the church @ 419-243-1829.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.



Who Are Associates?

Associates are lay women and men who promise to live their lives, both personal and professional, with the charism, spirit, and mission of the Sisters

The Sisters of Notre Dame bring Associates the lived experience of a long-standing spiritual tradition that has withstood the test of time and has given direction to many seekers.

The Sisters and the Associates inspire, challenge, and stretch one another. They are a gift to each other.

Unlike vowed mothers, Associates do not take vows, vote or participate in the governance of the congregation. Their commitment has no canonical binding power, between Associates and the Sisters of Notre Dame there is no mutual financial or legal responsibility.

Associates do share in spiritual opportunities for prayer, retreats, workshops, Bible groups of faith sharing experiences and other outreach activities in helping the needy and people who are marginalized. If and when you feel that God is calling you to participate in the Sisters of Notre Dame Associate Program for the preparation of making a commitment or covenant, please contact Sr. France Marie Penwell at fpenwell@sndusa.org as soon as possible.

Snow Emergency

Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a Level 3 Snow Emergency during which all roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio or internet, making a spiritual Communion. When Mass is cancelled, all other diocesan, parish, or school events in the geographic area are also cancelled.


