Dear People of God,

At the recent quarterly Deans Meeting with the Bishop, an important topic came up which deserves mention in the parish: namely, normative behaviors during Mass. What we do during the celebration of the Eucharist is supposed to follow the normative regulations of the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) as adjusted for our American culture by the Conference of Bishops. Here are a few of them which deserve special attention:

Before the Mass begins – the GIRM asks that we enter quietly so those praying can do so without a lot of distraction. That means visiting at the back should be done quietly, especially once the rosary devotion, exposition or any other devotion has begun.

During Mass -- the GIRM asks that we pay attention to the various actions, songs, and prayers of the Mass and not visit with our neighbors or read the bulletin. Responses should be bold; those nearby ought to be able to tell we're actually involved in the prayers of the mass.

At Communion – the GIRM asks that we offer veneration to the real presence by bowing before we accept the real presence. Too often that bow is done to the back of the person ahead of us. It should not be; rather, we ought to bow respectfully before the Eucharist itself. We need not feel rushed or hurried to get this action out of the way; the Distributor will wait for us.

At Communion – the GIRM asks that we ordinarily take the real presence in our hands, not on the tongue (the practice of communion on the tongue arose during the Middle Ages when people came over to Mass directly from the field or stable and had not washed their hands). The left palm should rest on the right until the real presence has been placed on the open palm and then the right hand should take the real presence and bring it to our lips.

At Communion – The Conference of Bishops has forbidden the use of intinction (dipping the host in the Precious Blood), even with a paten because far too many people rush things and the Precious Blood drips on the floor.

At Communion – the GIRM and the Holy Fathers since St. John Paul II have asked that we approach the Eucharistic Minister standing and do not kneel to receive the real presence in order to prevent the person behind us tripping and falling on top of us.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call the church @ 419-243-1829.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.



*** Snow Emergency

Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a Level 3 Snow Emergency during which all roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio or internet, making a spiritual Communion. When Mass is cancelled, all other diocesan, parish, or school events in the geographic area are also cancelled.
