Dear People of God,

Once again the soil of the land Jesus walked runs with the blood of the innocent: these include innocent Jews who were slaughtered by agents of evil launching their atrocities from the Gaza Strip and Lebanon while responses to those attacks have led to the shedding of innocent blood among the people of Gaza/Palestine and Lebanon. Our prayers ascend to the heavens for all of the innocents, that the God of the Covenant, the God of Israel, of the Arab peoples, of Christians and, as we heard in the Prophet Isaiah, the God who is God of all peoples, will intervene to change minds, hearts and souls so that the dignity of every human being might be respected by all other human beings and an era of true and genuine peace prevail.

Sadly, we have become inured to the reality of war and violence and pay it little heed. Wars rage in Africa, South America, Asia, Europe, and slowly but surely they move farther and farther back into the newspaper or news broadcast until they are lost to our view altogether. It's not because we're hard-hearted; rather, the tragedy of the human condition is that there are far too many wars, atrocities, and acts of violence to keep track of even a small part of the whole. Most of us don't even know where Niger is, where Kosovo is, who the Kurds are, what Black Diamonds are, what the hourly wage being paid to children mining cobalt might be, what gang violence is doing to families in Haiti.

As Catholic Christians we have an obligation to do what we can to resolve these grave problems but most of us can do little more than pray or perhaps send a donation for one relief effort or another. Sadly, even the greatest level of generosity would do little to make a dent in what is required to mend the wounds that affect the human community; that means we must resort to greater efforts to pray as a community, as families and as individuals. Prayer is powerful. It has been called the Christian's' greatest and most effective weapon against the maladies which continued to fester in our human family.

Please, take time to make time to pray. Be an active participant at Mass, take up the Rosary and enter into contemplation of the peace promised by every one of the twenty mysteries; pray by yourself, pray with your family, but above all – pray. Perhaps our God will hear us and do what we cannot on our own do.

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office. **Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults**: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.




Thank you for all your generous donations to the The Outreach Center this year. The Christmas giveaway was a tremendous

We hope you have "adopted a poinsettia" to take home and nurture! Check with Barb Marguis or Mary Jo to see if there are still some here. They do need a good home.





Snow Emergency

Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a Level 3 Snow Emergency during which all roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled. Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio or internet, making a spiritual Communion. When Mass is cancelled, all other diocesan, parish, or school events in the geographic area are also cancelled.




Padre Pio: Between Heaven and Earth

Christ Child volunteers teach newborn classes; tutor school children; staff school libraries and much more. The group purchases and distributes over 2000 new






coats, hats, gloves and books each year for children birth through eighth grade. They also distribute more than 1,200 baby layettes to underserved new moms.
