Dear People of God,

I had hoped to provide a somewhat extended study of the current Eucharistic Renewal; however, since we've arrived at Ash Wednesday and Lent, I will take a diversionary roadway for a few weeks to examine our only remaining penitential season. Lent is forty days, a number with great significance throughout sacred history. You may be surprised to learn that the number forty (40) occurs over one-hundred and fifty times from Genesis through Revelations. A few of those occurrences are familiar: for example, Jesus' forty days in the desert, the forty-day rainfall of Noah, the forty years' trek from Egypt to the Promised land and you may remember that Moses spent forty days on the mountain in the presence of God. Each of those events should provide a key to understanding our own forty days of Lent.

Comparing these biblical references, you'll note that all of them have to do with some kind of purification or renewal. Each of those events presages some action to be undertaken on behalf of God. Jesus' forty days prepare him for the beginning of his public ministry, Noah's forty days afloat prepare him and his family to repopulate the earth, Moses' forty days get him ready to bring the Law down to the people and the forty-year pilgrimage certainly prepared the Israelites for being God's holy people in the promised land. These inspire us to think of Lent as a time of purification and renewal.

The Church understands the days of Lent as a time for penance as penance is traditionally meant to be: the inward spiritual purification of the individual to undertake God's unique plan for that individual. Each of us exists because God wants us here to do something on his behalf. Coming to grips with our spiritual purpose is more difficult than discovering our purpose in life. Most of us have a career or are on our way to achieving one and that gives us a temporal or secular purpose which we fulfill by doing our job well. Getting in touch with God's plan for our spiritual mission requires that we stand back from the material/secular and contemplate God's "bigger picture" and where any of us fits into that broader canvas of God's will.

Lent provides, if used wisely, just that opportunity by immersing us in the traditional Lenten practices: almsgiving (awareness of the needs of others), works of charity (acts of love and concern for others), prayer (with an emphasis on just being quiet and listening to God), and acts of self-sacrifice (penance – what we give up for the good of the larger community). None of these is easy these days because our culture has trained us to put ourselves before others: rather than do good for them, we wait impatiently for them to do good for us. Bill Maher recently did a piece on the popular songs our children are singing these days. The lyrics are directly opposed to the Lenten practices and focus instead on wanting, having, holding, keeping, demanding and otherwise being served by everyone else. If the song doesn't feature those notions, it will often call on the singer and its audience to be sad that they didn't have, grab, hold, keep, etc.

Rather than be concerned about getting to the parking lot before all the greedy selfish people who take our preferred spot close to the door, Lent invites us to think about maybe, just maybe, finding a space a little farther away so that on the way in, we can think about how we fit into God's plan to accomplish something good for somebody else before they even think to do anything for us. Consider trying this mental approach as you come to mass.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call the church @ 419-243-1829.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
