Dear People of God,

A blessed and happy Easter to you all! May the warmth of God's love pervade your celebration of the Christ's Resurrection.

Easter recalls life and the promise of our own eternal life after we fall apart from old age in this world or otherwise confront our end. All of us have a built-in sense of the eternal, that our existence ought to go on and on and never end; that sense is reflected in our understanding of the Scriptures which tell us that death came about because of human folly (it often still does.) Most of us can reflect on all the things we're doing wrong that will lead our body to fail and death to come stalking - the sin of Adam which leads all of us to sin. But Scripture also includes the promise of God to take us in after physical death because the soul cannot die. Jesus chose to rise from the dead, not to show off or to prove he's God but to reveal what lies out there in our own future, our own resurrection to life that will never end.

We ought to give thought to that life that's waiting for us as much as we give thought to this life. Sadly, we don't so death catches us by surprise: we tend to think of it as a terrible ending rather than the bright beginning it's meant to be. Easter gives us the opportunity to undertake that more promising and happier sort of reflection, to consider what our resurrection to eternal life will be like and where it will take us.

Easter also has some traditions we might mistakenly think of as non-religious so let's look at a few. The Easter egg is symbolic of the tomb; if you travel to East St. Louis, stop at the Shrine of Our Lady of the Snows and take a look at the resurrection area – it's an egg! The Easter Bunny is symbolic of life springing up out of the ground since the bunny lives in a burrow and can quite literally spring. Easter candy, which you might think has nothing to do with anything religious, is symbolic of a phrase from the Bible: Taste and see the sweetness of the Lord. SO, without realizing it, people of little or no faith are actually being evangelized by those Easter traditions.

Have a great day as you keep Easter with whatever traditions are those of your family. May God continue to bring you close to his abiding love.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office. **Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults**: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.



Health News for March 31, 2024

Medical Scans Explained: Other Scans Ultrasound. It sends sound waves into the body. Different types of tissue reflect sound waves differently. These differences can be picked up by an ultrasound machine and turned into a picture. Ultrasound is helpful for looking at the heart and other organs, or a developing baby. Nuclear Imaging. These tests use a tiny amount of a radioactive substance, or "tracer." Most tracers are injected into the body, but some are inhaled or swallowed. The tracers inside the body release radiation that can be measured by a detector outside the body. The type of tracer differs depending on what the doctors want to see.

Positron Emission Tomography (PET) Scan. This often uses a radioactive sugar to diagnose cancer. When cancer cells take up the radioactive sugar, they can be seen with the PET scanner.




Am I Saved? | The Search | Episode 6
