Dear People of God,

Today's letter touches on Irish Catholic history with some comment on the four major patrons of Ireland. I hope you know they are Patrick, Bridget of Kildare, Brendan the Navigator, and Columbkille or Columba. Today Patrick is considered by the Christian world as the foremost of these four but until fairly recent times, he was second-best to one or another of the others.

It comes as a surprise to some that Patrick isn't Irish. He was born to a Welsh-Roman family in an age when the Empire was crumbling and a variety of raiding groups were active. One of those raiding parties kidnapped Patrick and hauled him off to the Emerald Isle where he was a farmer, sheepherder and slave. He escaped, made his way to England and eventually to the mainland where he was ordained and elected to return to pagan Ireland to bring them the Good News of Jesus Christ. The rest is history. He is credited with converting not less than three of the High Kings, establishing a number of monastic houses, and inspiring the construction of numerous churches, oratories and cathedrals.

Perhaps the first of the great patrons was Bridget of Kildare. She aspired to the religious life; as there weren't a lot of options for women, she began making those options by founding numerous women's houses all across Ireland. Like many women throughout the history of the Church, she was outspoken and courageous so didn't mind sharing her piety or her ideas with the high and the mighty. Like many women throughout Church history, she became a powerful voice for the people of the Church rather than its leaders. She was popular when living and became an intercessor once she died.

Brendan and Columbia were members of monastic orders. Ireland proved to be a fertile ground for recruiting monks; many of them became well-known and ultimately saints. Irish monasticism, unlike its continental counterpart, did not expect the monks to take a vow of stability (to live perpetually in one place) but expected those who could to enter into the missionary field and spread the Good News to places where Jesus was unknown.

Brendan took that commission seriously: shortly after ordination he took to the road and, given that Ireland is surrounded by water, to the sea. With a band of brothers, he set sail to find places where missionaries were needed, keeping a lengthy and detailed journal of his travels. He established monastic houses in many of the places he evangelized, giving much of the ancient world a definite Irish complexion. His knowledge of the ocean, its currents and its shores led to his being considered a master seaman and hence the title "Navigator."

Columba also took seriously the commission to go to all nations and, like Brendan, began his missionary efforts shortly after being ordained. He made his way across the water to the island of Iona, an outpost of the pagan Scots, where he established the first of many monastic houses and perhaps the one best known today. He traveled to the British Isles, spent years evangelizing Scotland and the north of England, and dispatched his disciples to the mainland where they converted the tribes of northern Europe. Although an Irishman, he is the primary patron of Scotland.

If we ever need models to inspire our own role as evangelizers, our major Irish patrons offer inspiration.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.



Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.


Thanks to all our helpers with Mothers' Day events...flowers, bake sale! You guys are the best!


No hospitality on Memorial Day weekend as you all picnic away! Let's remember those who gave so much for us so that we could celebrate.


1 and 2 Kings | Old Testament: Book Overviews | The Bible Project
