Dear People of God,

Today we will continue with some Irish history. As I mentioned last week, Brendan and Columba were monks and Bridget of Kildare was a nun. All three were founders of religious houses in an era when printing was unknown. If you wanted a copy of the Bible or the works of Aristotle or perhaps the writings of the early Church Fathers, you had to find one and make a copy. You may recall these works as Illuminated Manuscripts which were meticulously handmade with magnificent illustrations. Everyone likely knows the most famous of these, the Book of Kells, is held by the library of Trinity University in Dublin. There are others and they play a vital role in today's understanding and practice of Christianity.

During the so-called Dark Ages many of the original works on the mainland copied by the Irish monks and nuns disappeared as various conquerors stole everything of value, including written manuscripts. All of that going back and forth led to many of the written works being destroyed, lost or divided into various pieces. None of that occurred in Ireland where copies remained intact until the English reductions. Because copying those works had been a major project, if one copy got lost, there were others of equal beauty and originality. Much of what we have today has been handed down from those Irish originals.

As for the practice of our faith, the Irish monks, especially those who hit the road to spread the Good News, wanted to make things easy for their audiences, most of whom were unlettered [they could neither read nor write]. Rather than produce a written Bible, copiers made sure to illustrate many of the stories, psalms and other books of the Bible so people who couldn't read would still be able to get the idea if they managed to get to a church which had a copy. Considered important teaching devices, many of those illustrations were translated into the windows; many of today's magnificent art glass windows are a direct result of that Irish idea.

Because those early evangelizers also wanted to make the celebration of the sacraments simpler, they began to develop rituals which were easier to understand and to administer. Perhaps the most powerful of these was the introduction of private, auricular confession [the way we do it today]. In much of southern Europe, it was still the custom to go to the cathedral and confess in front of the crowd, an embarrassing event which led to the rule about confessing serious sin at least once a year during Lent. Irish monks invited sinners of every stripe to simply come to a priest, confess only to him and celebrate God's love in the words of absolution. As with anything, though, it didn't take long for people to wonder if their penance was adequate for the sin so the monks came up with a unique solution: the Penitential, a book which listed every possible sin and an appropriate recompense for having committed it. Steal a dime from Mom's purse? The Penitential could be opened to the chapter on stealing and the list could be read by the monk who then knew that a penance of one hour of hard work done without payment was adequate to make up for what Mom had lost. Note that the penance was an act, not a prayer, and could be done without a big sign announcing somebody was doing penance. Private auricular penance was immensely popular.

Irish history enables us to not only learn about the 4 major patronal saints but also to see how the passage of time influenced our understanding and practice of Christianity.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Recognizing Postural Orthostatic Tachycardia Syndrome (POTS). POTS is an abbreviation for Postural Orthostatic Tachycardia Syndrome. Postural means it's linked to your body's position. Orthostatic is related to standing. Tachycardia means rapid heart rate. And syndrome means it's a group of symptoms. A condition called POTS can have a huge impact on a person's life. POTS can affect anyone at any age. It is most common in women, ages 15 to 50; Its causes are unknown. Researchers suspect there can be different causes, and each might require different treatments.
