Dear People of God,

I recently had a parishioner ask me about the case of the deacon in Detroit who was reprimanded for celebrating baptism by saying "we baptize you. . ." Since that got me to thinking about the sacraments in general, over the next few weeks I will be offering some insights into the seven sacred moments which make Jesus truly present. I hope you all know them: the sacraments of initiation are Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. The sacraments of healing are Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick and the sacraments of vocation are Marriage and Orders. If you follow along over the series, you'll discover why there isn't an eighth and never will be. Remember that for the ancients, 7 was a mystical number that meant perfection so we might conclude that seven sacraments is the perfect number.

The sacraments were given to the ecclesial community formed by the disciples and belong to the Church. How and when any of them can be celebrated is generally left to the determination of the Church through its official leadership currently vested in the Curia in Rome. The one exception to this general rule is Baptism which can be administered by anyone at any time although we should not willy-nilly be baptizing people; most Catholics understand that so may undertake a private baptism in danger of death (commonly at the neonatal intensive care unit by a nurse or other person, but a record is kept of anything like that).

The sacraments require the simultaneous conjunction of matter (the physical "stuff" which symbolizes the spiritual realty) and the form, or words which make the reality present. Since the form, or words, are determined by the Church, the individual celebrant is not allowed to make up some words which he or she might think does the job. Form is an external assurance that the same effects are generated every time just as the matter (those required physical materials) are always the same. If we want Baptism to make the presence of God come alive for the baptized, then we must make sure we perform the rite exactly the same every time and everywhere so the form, regardless of the language being used, will always consist of the same words. The Detroit case came up because the words weren't the same as those being used universally.

The same can be said of the matter which must be the same everywhere; consequently there are precise requirements on what the physical materials are to be and there should be no variations. I'll demonstrate how this works as we take a walk through the sacraments in the next few editions of these letters.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call the church @ 419-243-1829.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

My name is Den, Jacob Livecchi and my home parish is St. Jgnatius in Oregon. I grew up in a large Catholic family of ten kids (I am number five). I was homeschooled and after graduating from high school in 2015, I went to the University of Toledo. After one year of college where I studied visual arts, I felt the Lord calling me to something more. I felt within my heart the Lord calling me to discern the prisethood. So, I entered college seminary at the Pontifical College Josephinum in Columbus studying philosophy. I finished my Bachelor of Philosophy and graduated in 2019 from Sared Heart Major Seminary in Detroit. I then began my theological studies at the Pontifical North American College in Rome.
