Dear People of God,

We're taking a look at the seven sacraments of the Catholic Church and today we'll focus on the first of the sacraments of initiation: Baptism.

I suspect all of us have been at a baptism ceremony and know it has a beginning, several different rituals and an end. The required form and matter are "I baptize you in the name of the father and of the son and of the Holy Spirit" in conjunction with the pouring, sprinkling, immersing of or in water. In this sacrament the actual words are derived directly from the Gospels where Jesus tells his disciples to "go, teach all nations, baptizing them. . ." The Church requires that the form begin with the singular "I," not the communal "we." The reason for this may seem obscure, but remember that the sacraments are always God doing the real work to bring the celebrant into communion with Jesus Christ so it's not the people gathered or the family but Jesus who's words we're quoting: that means we would always use the beginning "I."

The matter is water. It must be water, not something which includes water as an ingredient or to which something else has been added. In the Latin (Roman Catholic) Rite it is not necessary to dip the person into water but there must be some water used, generally by pouring. For particular reasons (e.g. the pandemic), it could be sprinkled but there is no reason someone being baptized couldn't be immersed if the available water is deep enough to accomplish that. Immersion is rare in the Catholic tradition for several reasons largely having to do with purity of the water and not having enough room to build a font big enough for immersion with all of the necessary heating and filtration equipment.

The actual rite of baptism (matter and form together) is expressed amid several other ritual actions which are not necessary to effect baptism but help those involved to better understand the rich detail of God's work being accomplished. Presume we're at a child's baptism: the additional rituals will be very different than those experienced by an adult or older adolescent preparing for Baptism. When a baby or young child is presented for the sacrament, it is the love of the child and of God which impels the parents to bring them to Church so that the child can immediately share in the graces poured into the child by God. Yes, the sacrament releases one from the bonds of original sin so might be seen (wrongly) as a key to get into heaven and avoid that other unmentionable place; however, it should be thought of more properly as the beginning of a relationship with Jesus (the one Protestants are so eager to mention: knowing Jesus as my personal Lord and Savior) and with the community of like believers who regularly (each Sunday) share the foundational statement of faith. For the very young the sacrament works for the child but many of the rituals are addressed to parents and sponsors so they know what to teach the child as (s)he comes of age.

# The Celebration of Sacraments

**Infant Baptism**: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>**: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call the church @ 419-243-1829.

**Penance**: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony**: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

**Pastoral Care of the Sick**: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.







## An invitation to join! CHRIST CHILD SOCIETY OF TOLEDO WHERE LOVE LEADS TO ACTION

The Christ Child Society of Toledo (CCS Toledo) is welcoming new members to their all-volunteer, non-profit organization. The Christ Child Society founder, Mary Virginia Merrick, advocated that personal contact with the needy for the love of Christ develops true charity and gives it vital force. The number of children in our community living in poverty and in need of resources Is growing. We invite you to consider becoming a member to help us reach out to more children here in northwest Ohio. We currently have over 200 members who donate over 10,000 service hours annually.

CCS Toledo volunteer members can choose to participate in a variety of programs and projects that we offer to serve the needs of underserved children. CCS Toledo's largest program is CLOTH-A-CHILD. Each Fall the organization purchases and distributes over 2,000 new winter coats, hats and gloves to children from birth to eighth grade. We work with local schools and social service agencies to identify the kids in need. Each child also receives an age-appropriate new book with their coat to promote literacy. Last year we included a hygiene bag to the school children from fourth to eighth grade who received a coat. The bag contains essentials such as toothbrush & toothpaste, soap, deodorant, lip baim, wash cloths, shampoo, laundry detergent sheets and more.

Our LAYETTE program supplies a newborn layette package full of essential items for underserved new mothers to take home with their newborns. We supply over 1,000 layettes each year to local hospitals and social service agencies for distribution to moms in need of these resources. Tutoring students in Reading and Math skills at four local elementary schools is a favorite program for CCS Toledo members. Running and staffing the school libraries at two of the schools is also a CCS Toledo program.

CCS Toledo offers additional programs that volunteer members are involved in. There is something for everyone! Our motto is "Nothing is ever too much to do for a child".
