Dear People of God:

Last week I began our focus on the sacraments with a discussion of baptism in general and wrote that the actual rite is surrounded by some other ritual actions. Today identifies the schedule of the various rituals which precede and follow the actual Rite of Baptism:

The Welcome – calling for the name which derives from the scriptures in which God tells us he calls us by name from our mother's womb. The Church hopes parents are thinking spiritually as well as in a secular sense when choosing a name so that it in some way reflects the salvation effected by Jesus.

The commitment – the parents and sponsors agree to assist the newly baptized to remain faithful to the effects of the sacrament.

The signing – since salvation is a gift of the Cross, the child is signed with the cross to demonstrate participation in the mystery of the Cross.

The sealing – the first of two anointings. This one uses Oil of Catechumens to symbolize the summons to continuing growth in knowledge of God and his Church.

The blessing of water – stresses the role of water through salvation history.

The promises – a profession of the faith shared by those who are baptized symbolizing the content of the teaching to be handed on to the newly baptized.

Baptism - the conjunction of matter and form to actuate the real presence of God in the baptized.

Chrismation – the use of the Oil of Chrism to point to the elevated status of the baptized in the ecclesial community as "priest, prophet and king." Symbolizes the unity or equality of the baptized with his or her God.

The white garment – symbolizes the perfection of the soul from which original sin has been taken away by the love of God. There is also a challenge to "sin no more" as Jesus tells several people in the gospels.

The candle – significant of the light of Christ poured into the baptized and a challenge to keep that flame alive by a life united to that of Jesus.

The blessings – addressed to the parents as a strengthening to keep up the good work only begun at the baptismal ceremony.

When a private baptism has been done (for example in the neonatal intensive care unit), the other rituals are later performed as the 'completion of the rite' but the baptism worked; it accomplished what the sacrament is meant to accomplish: the beginning of a journey of faith which leads inexorably to the kingdom.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call the church @ 419-243-1829.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.





CHRIST CHILD SOCIETY

WHERE LOVE LEADS TO ACTION

The Christ Child Society of Toledo (CCS Toledo) is welcoming new members to their all-volunteer, non-profit organization. The Christ Child Society founder, Mary Virginia Merrick, advocated that personal contact with the needy for the love of Christ develops true charity and gives it vital force. The number of children in our community living in poverty and in need of resources is growing. We invite you to consider becoming a member to help us reach out to more children here in northwest Ohio. We currently have over 200 members who donate over 10,000 service hours annually.

CCS Toledo volunteer members can choose to participate in a variety of programs and projects that we offer to serve the needs of underserved children. CCS Toledo's largest program is

CLOTH-A-CHILD. Each Fall the organization purchases and distributes over 2,000 new winter coats, hats and gloves to children from birth to eighth grade. We work with local schools and social service agencies to identify the kids in need. Each child also receives an age-appropriate new book with their coat to promote literacy. Last year we included a hygiene bag to the school children from fourth to eighth grade who received a coat. The bag contains essentials such as toothbrush & toothpaste, soap, deodorant, lip balm, wash cloths, shampoo, laundry detergent sheets and more

Our LAYETTE program supplies a newborn layette package full of essential items for underserved new mothers to take home with their newborns. We supply over 1,000 layettes each year to local hospitals and social service agencies for distribution to moms in need of these resources. Tutoring students in Reading and Math skills at four local elementary schools is a favorite program for CCS Toledo members. Running and staffing the school libraries at two of the schools is also a CCS Toledo program.

CCS Toledo offers additional programs that volunteer members are involved in. There is something for everyone! Our motto is "Nothing is ever too much to do for a child". CCS Toledo members joyfully make this a reality! For more information on joining the Christ Child Society of Toledo, visit
