Dear People of God,

We've arrived at the Anointing of the Sick on our refresher on the sacraments. It's obviously a sacrament of healing and is derived from the Letter of St. James in which the author invites the people: If there be sick among you, bring them to the elders of the Church. . ." The sacrament has parallels in many ancient (and even modern) cultures. It wasn't that long ago that people in France and England trusted the "King's Touch" to bring about healing: people lined up whenever the royal personage showed up and begged for a simple touch to remedy their ills. Notably, the queen was often close behind offering a few coins to alleviate the pressing issues of poverty and hunger. We know from Scripture that many people also wanted to touch important people, or even, as the woman with the hemorrhage says, touch the hem of his garment. Watch coverage of a rock concert or political speech and see how many people still try to touch important people to get a little of that fame for themselves!

The matter of this sacrament is imposition of hands and anointing with oil. The hands have to be those of the priest or bishop, and the oil is generally pressed from olive seeds but can be any vegetable oil. While most anointing is done using oil blessed by the bishop at the Chrism Mass, the priest can bless oil as needed for this sacrament. The form is the words Through this holy anointing, may the Lord in His love and mercy help you with the grace of the Holy Spirit. May the Lord Who frees you from sin save you and raise you up.

The healing accomplished involves not merely some physical, emotional, mental or spiritual healing, but the forgiveness of sin so its relationship to Reconciliation can be seen. Sometimes the healing can be seen as well; however, often God has something in mind other than what brought us to the sacrament because God is far more aware of what we need to perfect our lives than we might be.

At one time Anointing was reserved for people close to death, and was known as Extreme Unction (the word unction means to smear with oil). That severely limited its application in the daily lives of people so following II Vatican Council, a serious attempt was made to broaden the understanding of healing so that the sacrament is more commonly used. However, there is still a special rite for the final moments of life. It's the same sacrament but in very different circumstances. It's often accompanied by a 'final' reception of the Eucharist called viaticum or food for the journey.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call the church @ 419-243-1829.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.





CHRIST CHILD SOCIETY. OF TOLEDO WHERE LOVE LEADS TO ACTION

The Christ Child Society of Toledo (CCS Toledo) is welcoming new members to their all-volunteer, non-profit organization. The Christ Child Society founder, Mary Virginia Merrick, advocated that personal contact with the needy for the love of Christ develops true charity and gives it vital force. The number of children in our community living in poverty and in need of resources is growing. We invite you to consider becoming a member to help us reach out to more children here in northwest Ohio. We currently have over 200 members who donate over 10.000 service hours annually.

CCS Toledo volunteer members can choose to participate in a variety of programs and projects that we offer to serve the needs of underserved children. CCS Toledo's largest program is

CLOTH-A-CHILD. Each Fall the organization purchases and distributes over 2,000 new winter coats, hats and gloves to children from birth to eighth grade. We work with local schools and social service agencies to identify the kids in need. Each child also receives an age-appropriate new book with their coat to promote literacy. Last year we included a hygiene bag to the school children from fourth to eighth grade who received a coat. The bag contains essentials such as toothbrush & toothpaste, soap, deodorant, lip balm, wash cloths, shampoo, laundry detergent sheets and more.

Our LAYETTE program supplies a newborn layette package full of essential items for underserved new mothers to take home with their newborns. We supply over 1,000 layettes each year to local hospitals and social service agencies for distribution to moms in need of these resources. Tutoring students in Reading and Math skills at four local elementary schools is a favorite program for CCS Toledo members. Running and staffing the school libraries at two of the schools is also a CCS Toledo program.

CCS Toledo offers additional programs that volunteer members are involved in. There is something for everyone! Our motto is "Nothing is ever too much to do for a child".
