Dear People of God,

Last week I addressed the internal or spiritual dimension of the connection between each of us and the divine presence of Jesus in the Eucharist; toward the end I mentioned Eucharistic Adoration. I hope all of us are aware that almost from the beginning of the Church, the Eucharist held the place of honor in what the Church taught and did. The sacrament was reserved (some was held back and kept in a secure place) so it could be taken to the sick or shut-in. The reserved Eucharist was venerated for what it is, the very presence of Jesus Christ under the external appearance of bread and wine. People would reverence the building in which the sacrament was reserved, perhaps stopping for a moment in front of the doors or bowing as they walked past. Some would go in and walk up to where the sacrament was reserved and spend a few minutes in prayer. Over time this led to what we call Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, i.e. taking the host out of the tabernacle and putting it into a magnificent device called the monstrance so people could see and venerate it more directly. In many places a special chapel was constructed where the monstrance was out for veneration continuously; elsewhere elaborate processions carried the Eucharist through town so people could reverence the divine presence even away from the church.

The Universal Church is involved in a significant attempt to renew interest in the Eucharist. Among the ways this is being done is to revive many of the practices around the Eucharist either in the tabernacle or exposed in the monstrance. Part of that effort focuses on people who had or have a great devotion to the Eucharist; among them is St. Manuel Gonzalez Garcia, a priest of Spain and Bishop of Málaga and later of Palencia. As a young priest he was sent by his bishop on a mission. When he arrived, he discovered that, like many of our contemporary churches, the place was abandoned and closed. Like many today, he was appalled that a sacred place was no longer alive with the faith. He then made a promise to God to do all he could to kindle a love of the Eucharist in the people so no church would ever suffer a similar fate but would be filled with the faithful who would let nothing stand between them and the divine presence of Jesus.

St. Manuel spent nearly forty years working to renew faith and devotion in the Eucharist. He traveled far and wide to speak of the miracle of Jesus' presence and the wonder it should inspire in those who believed. He addressed many of the same doubts that assail our modern culture, reminding people that to trust in God is to know God, to know God is to desire to be one with God and being one with God occurs in the Eucharist. He pointed to the tabernacle where the Eucharist is reserved and prayed that Catholics everywhere would revere that sacred enclosure for what it contains: Jesus the Almighty come to be one with his people.

May we all aspire to that same wonderful sense of Emmanuel – God with us.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.





CHRIST CHILD SOCIETY WHERE LOVE LEADS TO ACTION

The Christ Child Society of Toledo (CCS Toledo) is welcoming new members to their all-volunteer, non-profit organization. The Christ Child Society founder, Mary Virginia Merrick, advocated that personal contact with the needy for the love of Christ develops true charity and gives it vital force. The number of children in our community living in poverty and in need of resources is growing. We invite you to consider becoming a member to help us reach out to more children here in northwest Ohio. We currently have over 200 members who donate over 10,000 service hours annually.

CCS Toledo volunteer members can choose to participate in a variety of programs and projects that we offer to serve the needs of underserved children. CCS Toledo's largest program is

CLOTH-A-CHILD. Each Fall the organization purchases and distributes over 2,000 new winter coats, hats and gloves to children from birth to eighth grade. We work with local schools and social service agencies to identify the kids in need. Each child also receives an age-appropriate new book with their coat to promote literacy. Last year we included a hygiene bag to the school children from fourth to eighth grade who received a coat. The bag contains essentials such as toothbrush & toothpaste, soap, deodorant, lip balm, wash cloths, shampoo, laundry detergent sheets and more.

Our LAYETTE program supplies a newborn layette package full of essential items for underserved new mothers to take home with their newborns. We supply over 1,000 layettes each year to local hospitals and social service agencies for distribution to moms in need of these resources. Tutoring students in Reading and Math skills at four local elementary schools is a favorite program for CCS Toledo members. Running and staffing the school libraries at two of the schools is also a CCS Toledo program.

CCS Toledo offers additional programs that volunteer members are involved in. There is something for everyone! Our motto is "Nothing is ever too much to do for a child".
