Dear People of God,

After several weeks looking at the matter and form of the sacraments, we come to the end of the trail: The sacrament of Holy Orders.

When we think of Orders, we ordinarily think priesthood but there are actually three ranks associated with this sacrament: Deacon, Priest-presbyter and Priest-bishop. There is only one sacrament but the intention of the person doing the ordination is toward a different end for the different candidates; arriving at the Priest-bishop rank does not involve a new or different ordination but a particular consecration by another bishop appointed to do so with several other bishops concelebrating. In each case there is matter, the thing required to effect the sacrament and it is the same for each rank: the imposition of hands. The Church teaches and believes that by this imposition, as in any other sacrament, the power and actual presence of the divine is imparted on and within the recipient. Of course, the matter must be in conjunction with the form.

The form, or words which occur alongside the matter, vary from rank to rank, and specify to which rank the person is being admitted. There is a different required prayer for deacons, for priests and for bishops. While all three ranks have the same sacrament, each has associated obligations or responsibility for the administration of the other sacraments which are delineated in the prayer which is the form for that rank.

In brief, the priest-bishop, as successor to the Apostles, possesses the fulness of Orders because he can administer the six which require somebody from the Church to do them and can certainly witness the seventh: marriage, which you will recall, is administered by the parties.

The priest-presbyter administers all of the sacraments except Orders. There are restrictions in the administration of confirmation by the priest-presbyter – he can confirm only adults as part of the initiation of adults (baptism).

The Deacon is empowered by Orders to the service of the people of God and can administer only baptism. He may also serve as the official recording witness at weddings. The deacon cannot initiate adults because he cannot confirm and the same minister must do both. Ordinarily, the Deacon brings to the people the same ministries a lay person does but brings with that ministry the sacramental grace of Orders which makes it different – not superior but different in the way it illuminates the presence of Jesus in the specific moment.

Each of the seven sacraments focuses on some ordinary aspect of our being human, ennobles those behaviors and powerfully reminds us that in the image and likeness of God, we are called to "be holy as my heavenly father is holy."

The Celebration of Sacraments

<u>Infant Baptism</u>: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call the church @ 419-243-1829.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

CHRIST CHILD SOCIETY OF TOLEDO

WHERE LOVE LEADS TO ACTION

The Christ Child Society of Toledo (CCS Toledo) is welcoming new members to their all-volunteer, non-profit organization. The Christ Child Society founder, Mary Virginia Merrick, advocated that personal contact with the needy for the love of Christ develops true charity and gives it vital force. The number of children in our community living in poverty and in need of resources is growing. We invite you to consider becoming a member to help us reach out to more children here in northwest Ohio. We currently have over 200 members who donate over 10,000 service hours annually.

CCS Toledo volunteer members can choose to participate in a variety of programs and projects that we offer to serve the needs of underserved children. CCS Toledo's largest program is

CLOTH-A-CHILD. Each Fall the organization purchases and distributes over 2,000 new winter coats, hats and gloves to children from birth to eighth grade. We work with local schools and social service agencies to identify the kids in need. Each child also receives an age-appropriate new book with their coat to promote literacy. Last year we included a hygiene bag to the school children from fourth to eighth grade who received a coat. The bag contains essentials such as toothbrush & toothpaste, soap, deodorant, lip balm, wash cloths, shampoo, laundry detergent sheets and more

Our LAYETTE program supplies a newborn layette package full of essential items for underserved new mothers to take home with their newborns. We supply over 1,000 layettes each year to local hospitals and social service agencies for distribution to moms in need of these resources. Tutoring students in Reading and Math skills at four local elementary schools is a favorite program for CCS Toledo members. Running and staffing the school libraries at two of the schools is also a CCS Toledo program.

CCS Toledo offers additional programs that volunteer members are involved in. There is something for everyone! Our motto is "Nothing is ever too much to do for a child".
