

Dear People of God,

Our examination of what we might look for from the Synod on Synodality continues although we're still looking at things from some sixty years ago when the notion of everybody in the Church working together came to the fore. The Church's formative document on lay ministry, Apostolicam actuositatem, proposed a multi-themed initiation of lay ministries which would begin with the formation of the lay leadership in a specific area of ministry. We'll take a look at evangelization as our example along the way.

Training programs don't just ask people to open a book on evangelization and go to work; no, the idea is to provide a theological and scriptural basis for what evangelization is and how the early Church undertook it so successfully that an entire empire had been converted in less than a century. Training should include the "framework of parish:" the proper place for this important commission was part of the broader vision enabled by strategic planning for the future. A final aspect of training was to engender a spirit of companionship, the "two by two" of Jesus' initial evangelistic efforts under the aegis of synodality: we work together. The goal was to send the trained ministerial leader back to recruit the lead, the team or committee which would then articulate a broad training program meant to be inspired by the parish vision and the larger sense of the overall goals and scope of the Pastoral Council. The leader of the Evangelization Ministry was only one of several of many cogs in the parish wheel.

Had the goal of the Council been achieved, that formally trained parish minister of Evangelization would have recruited men and women from the parish to head up other recruited committees:

- Internal formation program team to educate the parish on what evangelization is;
- Small team formation leader to prepare for external evangelization of the parish neighborhood;
- Communications team to prepare evangelization materials for distribution in the parish area;
- Liaison team to welcome those evangelized to the parish;
- Etc.

Keep in mind that all of this was proposed sixty years ago when parish membership was still high and there were plenty of people in the pews who could be recruited to these various aspects of the Evangelization (or any other) team. Vibrant application then would have prevented the wholesale decline in membership many parishes experienced where no such development was even attempted.

In a sense the movement of the Holy Spirit begun in Rome didn't transition to the parish for several reasons. Key to its success was the pastor and, let's be honest, they don't like change any more than the people in the pew: many older and even younger pastors resented the demand to share authority with the laity and resisted efforts by the returning bishops to implement the goals of the various conciliar documents. Pastors had been trained to be micro-managers who wanted to do it all and made use of the Parish Council to rubber stamp decisions: this was, after all, the organizational structure of the pre-council Church. Perhaps, the Church discovered, you can't teach an old dog new tricks!

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call the church @ 419-243-1829.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
