Dear People of God,

I want to continue my lead-up to the Synod on Synodality and what we might expect it to recommend. Last week I briefly discussed the goals of the Second Vatican Council and ended by stating that the pastor was the key element in bringing forth the lay leadership (synodality) envisioned by the Council. The pastor remains the lynchpin even today: his vision and intentions toward involving laity remain a significant reality with which parishes must contend.

The Council understood this and laid out a framework which addressed both pastors then in place and the formation of pastors who would come along over the decades following. A major component was to form a mindset (what Paul VI referred to as a novum habitum cogitandi) or new way of thinking because the old way meant no real involvement at the higher level of leadership. The essential mode of action was supposed to be the delegation of real authority to those who had been trained to accept it; they were prepared to implement the broader goal of recruiting teams of men and women to engage the parish in the life of the community. The bishops returning from Rome were certainly enthused by this concept and began to set in place the ideas and goals but ran into that good old resistance to change: thus things stalled or stuttered along among the much smaller group of laity anxious to assume their proper role in the Church.

Real delegation means the actual transfer of a portion of the pastor's power to team leaders which depends on a couple of things including whether the Pastor has both the humility to realize he isn't the only "expert" in the parish and whether he trusts the person who supposedly has the expertise. Delegation isn't "dumping the responsibility" in anyone's lap but is the considered election of the laity to a full share in the decision-making facet of parish leadership in those areas open to significant lay involvement. If the pastor lacks trust, he may well insist on "second guessing" the team leaders, undermining their authority or diminishing their effectiveness. If the pastor is a micro-manager, he may well pre-empt the team leader unexpectedly or hover nearby to assure that there is no real leadership, only agreement with what the pastor wants. Where delegation has been authentically given, the pastor would trust that his teams and their leaders (1) know what to do, (2) do/did it and (3) pass on their actions to any other team which ought be involved given the Pastoral Council vision (outlined in the parish's strategic plan) for collaborative leadership.

Because many lay leaders were never exposed to authentic delegation and are unfamiliar with the real authority they have been given, they never achieve the potential for growing lay leadership in our parishes; that's why sixty years on we're still attempting to come up with strategies and best practices at the universal level (the Synod on Synodality) which can be modified as needed to fit the specific needs of the various regions and local Churches of the Catholic Ecclesial Community.

The Celebration of Sacraments

<u>Infant Baptism</u>: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call the church @ 419-243-1829.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.






