Honored Veterans, friends, and parishioners,

Welcome to this year's liturgical celebration of our many veterans, young and old, men and women, who have given of their lives in support of our military commitments here and abroad. Although the national celebration lies a week off, we are gathered today so that our vets can take full advantage of the many events and celebrations which will occur later. We pray that all will be able to be involved and will be shown proper respect and thanks for their service.

Most veterans don't go around with big neon signs with arrows pointing to them announcing "I Served," but I suspect all of us know many of those who did or are serving. These include an uncle or aunt, a father or mother, a child, niece or nephew, or that guy down the street who proudly wears an ancient and tattered American Legion baseball cap. We might mistakenly think of them as ordinary Americans who answered the call; however, I believe all of them are extraordinary Americans who could so easily have looked the other way rather than risk life and limb on a dangerous front. All are certainly made welcome on Veterans' Sunday, but here at Immaculate Conception we go beyond a one-day event to pray for and keep in our thoughts all of those who served and are out there right now defending not only our liberty, but that of the better part of an entire world. Today we're losing what has been called the "greatest generation," those soldiers, sailors, marines, pilots, merchant marines, coast guard and support personnel of the Second World War. Before that war ended, this parish already had a memorial for those who were part of the effort: you can still see it in the magnificent ceramic Pieta on the veterans' wall.

Other generations, the lost men and women of the Vietnam conflict and those who made their way to Korea, Kuwait, Iraq and numerous other places, took the place of that "greatest generation" by continuing the tradition of standing up for what's right even at tremendous risk. All of us who remain behind should give thanks for the will to serve demonstrated by so many. All of us who reman behind should show our support for those brave, willing men and women who stand guard on our behalf. All of us who remain behind should kneel in prayer, not only of thanks but ones of compassion for the wounded whose lives are forever changed.

In 2 days, the national season of voting will come to a close. Think of exercising your right to vote as a tribute to the many who have served our country in guaranteeing that right, ensuring our security and protecting our freedoms.

Welcome, Vets and families of Vets. We're proud to stand with you in prayer and celebration.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call the church @ 419-243-1829.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.




National Vocation Awareness Week

The Problem of Evil with Jimmy Akin






