Dear People of God,

November includes 2 days of national gratitude: Veterans day and Thanksgiving. Interestingly enough, the month also begins with two key events in the life of the Church: All Saints and All Souls. The first, celebrated on November 1, recalls the long-standing tradition of our Church that when Jesus rose from the dead, he brought along the souls of the just and sped them on their way to the kingdom even before he himself departed for heaven fifty days after the Resurrection. Those righteous ones include the saints and people of every race and nation, every background and IQ, every stature and color. Many of them we know by name, either because they come down to us from tradition or because somebody "canonized" them and officially declared them to be in heaven. For example, Abraham has never been canonized but we all know he made it into the heavenly realm. St. Peter, the first pope, was never canonized but the early Church recognized his holiness and knew he made it there as well. More recently the Church has been kept busy noting the many people of every age and place who lived a life here which merited life in heaven without delay. Two young people of our own era, Pier Giorgio Frassati and Carlo Acutis, will soon be declared among the saints in heaven.

What do we know about them or about any of the saints celebrated by the Church? Do we really know Peter? Or Pier Giorgio? Or Bernadette? What made these ordinary people, all of whom exhibited the typical problematic behaviors many of us may demonstrate, so holy that they are considered in God's presence forever? How well do we know the American saints? Here are a few: how many do you recognize? Marianne Cope, Theodore Guerin, Stanley Rother or Solanus Casey whose shrine in Detroit is less than an hour from Toledo. Do you know what the town of Grand Coteau, Louisiana, has to do with proving the sanctity of a "blessed" so he could become a saint?

Sadly, we know very little about saints and perhaps that's why we aren't on the road to being declared a saint! Most of us will have to settle for being celebrated on November 2, All Souls Day. Everybody dies but we only have limited ideas about what happens to them when they do – the soul cannot die so where does it go? We don't know and postulate three destinations: Heaven, Purgatory or Hell. Our hope as Christians who live the Law of Love is that no one goes to hell and some get right into heaven, but others must first make restitution for their sins in this life. Purgation is a cleansing, burning off the bad so only the good remains (you can read about it in Wisdom, 3: 1-9). All of us ought to desire to get into heaven without delay and that might get us to take a look at how the Saints did it. You can find hundreds of lives of the saints at the library or on FORMED. Why not take a look and get on the road now?

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call the church @ 419-243-1829.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Adult Vaccine Clinics

The Toledo Lucas County Health Department will host drop-in flu and COVID-19 vaccine clinics for adults at TLCPL branches in October & November. Influenza (Flu) vaccines will be available to all adults, whether insured, underinsured, or uninsured. COVID-19 vaccines will be available to adults who are underinsured or uninsured. All insurances may be billed, including Medicare Part B and Ohio Medicaid. No one will be turned away for inability to pay and insurance is not required to receive a vaccine. No appointment is needed; all services are first-come, first-served. Schedule: All clinics will be from 9:15am to noon.

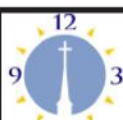

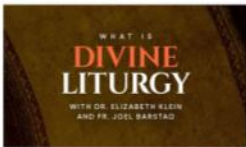
