Dear People of God,

With the Synod on Synodality now concluded, I want to take a look at lay leadership as it exists today and how the Synod might propose that it change (oops, there's that word "change" which none of us like).

Certainly, many parishes have successfully implemented the goals and aspirations of the Second Vatican Council. These parishes are thriving, growing and providing both internal ministries and evangelization out into the community around the parish. Some are big suburban parishes with thousands of active members while others are thriving in the inner city where evangelization has seen numerous men and women undertaking the journey through the Orders of Christian Initiation to become part of the parish.

Alternatively, many parishes struggle to maintain any real sense of lay leadership and ministry. Parishes in the suburbs which did not implement II Vatican are shrinking and find it difficult to meet ordinary expenses while in the inner city, we've all seen the deleterious effect of failing to energize the people in the pew.

What's the difference? In many ways it's the pastor who doesn't understand lay ministry and its unique potential; in others it's lay leaders who fail to grasp the importance of invitation and welcome to expanded teams of ministry volunteers. A ministry team is never a single person but a group of like-minded individuals who form a collective body of wisdom and energy to accomplish the goal of the ministry. All too often the single lay leader remains the single lay leader because (s)he approaches ministry with an "I'm the expert, we'll do it my way" attitude that does little to engender a desire to be involved on the part of others. As this sort of thing becomes the norm, people tend to back off and expect those single lay leaders to do it all; when they can no longer do it or decide they don't want to do it, the entire ministry falls apart. That scenario can be seen replicated in our own diocese where parishes slowly faded away until the people in the pew could no longer afford the buildings their predecessors sacrificed so much to see built and used.

An even worse situation is the lay leader who turns away willing volunteers and may actually send them scuttling to another parish where their gifts and talents can be put to good use. Parishes large and small cannot afford to see gifted individuals wander off into the sunset because right behind them will be the entire parish, like so many have and are doing today. Our diocese certainly has parishes in this tragic situation, among them some of the once largest parishes in the diocese that today survive not on the good will of the people but on the rental income from charter schools.

The Synod on Synodality will, in all likelihood, offer some insights into how the small parish, like ours, can effectively reverse the trend toward shrinking and become thriving, growing parishes. Much of that will depend on the proposals and how they are implemented with regard to the preparation of the laity to assume their rightful role and take on their proper obligations to the good order of the Universal Church.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call the church @ 419-243-1829.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.






