Dear People of God,

As I sit at my desk thinking it's nearly Thanksgiving, I wonder whether time is passing faster than usual. I believe one of the side-effects of Covid is that we notice the passing of time more than we did prior to the pandemic. It is already Thanksgiving this coming Thursday. It's a secular holiday which at one time had a deeply religious significance: the thanks we offered was to a generous God who blessed our nation with abundance enough for all and more to share with the world. Today's holiday has less emphasis on these "thanks." Perhaps families gather together to overeat and there may be some who offer from their resources for those who have less, but let's be honest, very few of those reading this will bother to come to Church and give thanks to God for the manifold blessings he has showered on us but just about everyone will turn on the TV and take in a football game or three or four. Our religion has become secular — our gods are television, movies, sports and for many, shopping so that the Black Friday ads will predominate in our reading on the festival day.

The Church has from the holiday's very beginning believed in Thanksgiving and titled its most precious and life-giving celebration Eucharist which is Greek for thanksgiving. When we gather together for the celebration of Christ's true presence, we give thanks first for God's mercy, for the forgiveness of sin. We then give thanks for the Word, the Scriptures which reveal God's compassion and love. At the Offertory we give thanks for the simple things, bread and wine, which later take on supernatural goodness as the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. And of course, we come up to the foot of the table of the Lord giving thanks for being one with him as we accept that Body and Blood and hopefully allow it to transform us into his presence in a world that so desperately needs it.

Some years ago Queen Elizabeth II experienced a host of personal and national disasters and referred to the year as the annus horribilis, the terrible year. All of us may well have a terrible year, suffering from the ill-effects of inflation, loss of family or friends, repair bills on the house that just about give us a heart attack yet, as the Queen summarized in her year-end address, we all have far more blessings than hurts, God is far more kind than the world is cruel. Perhaps we need to take time out from all of the distractions to genuinely reflect on what it is God has provided for us – the air we breathe, the beauty of a blue sky, the rain which refreshes our crops, the millions of people whose work assists us in so many ways that we can hardly count them all.

May the God of goodness reveal to you his many blessings this holiday and may you be the agency of blessing for many others.

The Celebration of Sacraments

<u>Infant Baptism</u>: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call the church @ 419-243-1829.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.



Emotional Wellness Checklist: Get Quality Sleep. To fit in everything we want to do in our day, we often sacrifice sleep. But sleep affects both mental and physical health. It's vital to your well-being. When you're tired, you can't function at your best. Sleep helps you think more clearly, have quicker reflexes and focus better. Take steps to make sure you regularly get a good night's sleep. To get better quality sleep:

- Go to bed and get up each day at the same time.
- Sleep in a dark, quiet place.
- Exercise daily.
- Limit the use of electronics.
- Relax before bedtime.
- Avoid alcohol before bedtime and stimulants like caffeine or nicotine.
- Consult a health care professional if you have ongoing sleep problems.


