Dear People of God,

I was asked the other day by someone who was perusing the hymnal why the readings are listed as Old Testament, New Testament and Gospel. Their question: Aren't the gospels the New Testament? The answer to that is "yes and no."

It's "yes" because the four gospels were all written by the Christian community after the death and resurrection of Jesus so form a body of writings which reflect on the intervention of God in fulfillment of the promises of the Old Testament. Throughout this Advent season, we hear what those promises are and they all point to their being accomplished by God himself who will come to shepherd his people rightly. We learn that the savior will suffer and die for his people. We learn that the savior will establish a kingdom without end. The authors of the works now included in the Bible have a lot to say, not only about the savior but how his redemptive work goes on despite the Ascension. The gospels fit into that collection but. . .

The answer is "no" because the gospels are a unique set of four works which deal directly and only with Jesus, his teachings and his commands to his disciples. We might think of the other works as commentaries on those four major works despite some of those other writings actually being older than the gospels. Or we night think of the gospels as being about Jesus and all the other works of the New Testament being about you and me and where we fit into the continuing mission and ministry of Jesus.

Paul's letters, for example, include a lot of information about his credentials to be a teacher and tell us how we ought to comfort ourselves if we claim to be Christian. His letters go on to include extensive commentary on the difference between the behaviors of those not baptized and those who are, calling for a conversion of action in addition to the conversion of faith. He doesn't shy away from calling people out for retaining pagan ways and demands that the activities of the unbaptized be utterly rejected in favor of the works of the Christian. It's very different form the far more universal manner in which Jesus addresses many of those same things.

However, whether we follow the liturgical headings and refer to the Old Testament, New Testament and Gospels, or follow the table of contents of the Bible on our night stand which lists Old Testament Books and New Testament Books, the history of salvation remains the same: God in love created us, we rejected that love but God promises a savior who is Jesus the Christ. For further information, check out FORMED which has many titles covering the formation of our Bible.

# The Celebration of Sacraments

**Infant Baptism**: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>**: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call the church @ 419-243-1829.

**Penance**: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony**: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

**Pastoral Care of the Sick**: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.





These students undertook to become familiar with the two patrons of the Universal Church's Eucharistic Renewal and immediately were drawn to Blessed Carlo Acutis, a young teen who by the age of fifteen when he died had researched and developed two magnificent poster collections, one focused on the Eucharistic Miracles and another on Mary's numerous apparitions. 
