Dear People of God,

A joyous and most blessed Christmas to you all.

As we celebrate the birth of Jesus, there is much on which we can reflect during this holy season beyond the presents under the tree or the festive dinner or the myriad football games on the schedule during Bowl Season. (Go Bucks!)

If we take the events of Jesus' birth, we might think about "stuff." There was none in the cave or barn where he was born. He came in simplicity and innocence and we might give thought to how we manage to do or not do that in our own lives. Are we happy with little or do we crave what we don't have?

How about those gifts of the Magi? Do we count the gifts under the tree with our name on them? Do we consider why we get what we do? The Magi brought specific things which were essential, not at the beginning of life but at its end. They declare from the moment of his birth that this innocent child must die. You can find some interesting commentary on this by going to FORMED and putting three gifts in the search engine, but in essence, two gold coins were put on the deceased person's eyes to sustain the gleam of the living, frankincense was used to mask the stink of decay around then tomb and myrrh was smeared over the body to hold it together longer.

We might give thought to where Jesus was born beyond there being a cave or barn. He was born ninety miles from where Joseph and Mary lived. No cars, no trains, no hi-speed railroads. They walked (tradition suggests Mary rode on a donkey but there were few two-person models so Jospeh walked). When they got there, they were homeless, without shelter, begging for a place to stay at a key moment in Mary's pregnancy. What must that have been like? How does that compare to taking our four hundred horsepower version of the sleigh to get to Grandma's warm, comfortable house for that big turkey dinner?

As we pause to celebrate a birthday, we should very carefully consider the circumstances of that birth and perhaps allow them to percolate into our own way of life.

May your holy day be one of peace and friendship, of family and the warmest blessings of the God of love whose son we celebrate. Merry Christmas, Frueh Weinachzeit, Nollaig Shona, Joyeux Noël and for all of you from Birmingham, Boldog Karácsonyt.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call the church @ 419-243-1829.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.



Tuesday, January 14, 2025 at the 9:00 AM Mass Immaculate Conception Church, Toledo

Please join us as we celebrate the addition of this beautiful piece of art that was designed by the 2024 8th Grade Class of Queen of Apostles. These students undertook to become familiar with the two patrons of the Universal Church's Eucharistic Renewal and immediately were drawn to Blessed Carlo Acutis, a young teen who by the age of fifteen when he died had researched and developed two magnificent poster collections, one focused on the Eucharistic Miracles and another on Mary's numerous apparitions. Wanting to share their interest and love of the Eucharist, the students then began raising funds to design and have fabricated a statue of Blessed Carlo as seen through their eyes.
