Dear People of God,

I wanted to add a final comment on the Synod on Synodality which issued its final document on 24 October last year. As far as I have been able to determine, the only language currently available is Italian (excerpts in English can be found at several sources) so what follows is based on my reading of the original.

The Synod recognized that "the church is the people of God retelling the story of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ." The document then calls on the people of God to live out the story in their own way of life, be that the bishop, his priests, vowed religious or those who in the past who have been relegated to sitting in the pews. As I hinted, the document refers often to fulfilling the mandates of the Second Vatican Council, for example, in Lumen gentium: the people of God should recognize that they are together a holy people and make it a point to live holy lives in witness to the salvation won for them by Jesus.

Baptism brings us into a relationship with God himself but all too often, writes the Synod, we forget that it also grants to each baptized the role of prophet, the wandering minister of God's truth or in modern parlance, the missionary so that the Church must always be "missionary." The term means sent and if sent, then to accomplish something. What each baptized is to accomplish is nothing less than proclaiming in ways typical to their calling in life that they are one with God. To energize this mission, the Synod reminds us that the Eucharist, celebrated every Sunday, is the fundamental obligation of all the baptized (which opens the door to a lengthy discussion of ecumenical activity to return all the baptized to the Eucharist). The Eucharist sheds light on the unity of the church in all its forms, from the family to the universal unity of all people with the world in which we live. As I mentioned in one of my previous letters on this topic, that calls for a new way of thinking about every person who forms the Church, the Body of Christ.

Examining the signs of the times (wars, violence, climate change destroying habitats, etc.), the Synod proposes that on-going reform of our thinking should begin to open the way for all men and women to be actively involved at some level in the work of the Church. For many that means a richer sense of participation in the secular world as missionaries of God's peace and love for all (a radical shift from most political viewpoints) and for many a much greater use of their gifts and talents in the Church. Admitting that the bishop remains the ultimate authority in his diocese, the synod proposes enhancing the structural role of the laity in the actual management of the parish. That calls for a far greater emphasis on preparing people to (1) recognize their particular gift, (2) prepare themselves to make use of it within the context of the broader mission of the Church and (3) take up leadership roles apt to those talents. It isn't up to anyone to presume to have some special ability but to recognize that their participation in the life of the parish is a unique calling and then to undertake the necessary preparation to assume that role (that's the idea behind the call to be a deacon – somebody who is already deeply committed hears the Holy Spirit asking that they take another step).

The Synod envisions a greater role for the Pastoral Council but warns that in order to make this happen, people need to be prepared to undertake some form of special training just as we expect our bishops, priests, vowed religious and deacons to do now. I've expended more space than usual for this letter so I'll quit by inviting you to both keep watch for the English language version of the document as it arrives on the bookshelves of your favorite library or at the new Reger's and to be alert to your potential to take on a new role in your parish.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call the church @ 419-243-1829.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Health News for January 12, 2025

Consuming energy drinks raises important safety concerns.

Between 2007 and 2011, the number of energy drink-related visits to emergency departments doubled. In 2011, 1 in 10 of these visits resulted in hospitalization.

About 25 percent of college students consume alcohol with energy drinks, and they binge-drink significantly more often than students who don't mix them.

The CDC reports that drinkers aged 15 to 23 who mix alcohol with energy drinks are four times more likely to binge drink at high intensity (i.e., consume six or more drinks per binge episode) than drinkers who do not mix alcohol with energy drinks.

Drinkers who mix alcohol with energy drinks are more likely than drinkers who do not mix alcohol with energy drinks to report unwanted or unprotected sex, driving drunk or riding with a driver who was intoxicated, or sustaining alcohol-related injuries.

In 2011, 42 percent of all energy drink-related emergency department visits involved combining these beverages with alcohol or drugs (such as marijuana or over-the-counter or prescription medicines).
