Dear People of God,

A couple of items this week: First, we recently celebrated the memorial of St. Agnes, a name meaning "lamb." A martyr of the early Church, on that memorial day lambs are shorn in northern Italy and the wool is woven into cloth that will become the pallia (a collar or stole-like garment worn by the Metropolitan of an ecclesiastical province; Ohio's Metropolitan is the Archbishop of Cincinnati). The finished pallia (pallium in the singular) will be blessed by the Holy Father on the Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul (June 29) and presented to newly installed archbishops. It's a wonderful tradition which ties our modern Church to its ancient origins.

My second point is to mention that we are in Year III of the three-year cycle of readings, now focusing on the Gospel of Luke. The general theme of Luke's first volume (the second is the Acts of the Apostles) is that in Jesus, God constitutes a New Covenant with his people, a covenant sealed by the presence of Jesus in the community, primarily in the Eucharist and all the other sacraments. When you listen to the readings as we move through the next thirty four weeks, you'll hear this theme over and over. Today, for example, the gospel reminds us that Jesus didn't waste any time in letting people know that the Old Testament is over. He boldly says "today this passage is fulfilled in your midst," and it's in him that the fulfillment occurs.

According to tradition, Luke was a physician and as such, he had access to women who were not permitted to mingle with men. Another interesting facet of this gospel is the enhanced inclusion of stories told by or about women. We heard one of the most important a few weeks ago in the birth narrative. Note that in Luke's gospel, the angel appears to Mary, not Jospeh as in Matthew's account of the birth of Jesus which is oriented toward the Old Testament model. Luke not only records the angelic greeting to Mary but then recounts her trek to see another woman, Elizabeth, who is the first person to openly proclaim the presence of the Messiah: "Who am I that the mother of my savor should come to me?"

The longest parables are also part of the Gospel of Luke, as for example the prodigal son or the Samaritan "good neighbor" story. Tradition tells us that while Paul was in Jerusalem defending the conversion of the gentiles before the Apostolic college, Luke was wandering around collecting stories from witnesses to the life and times of Jesus. That would suggest that while Luke's version was the last of the three synoptic (from the same point of view) gospels, it's also the one which includes some of the most memorable of Jesus' stories told by people who knew him.

Listen carefully over the next weeks and hear about that wonderful new Covenant of which you form an important part.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call the church @ 419-243-1829.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Winter Skin Care. To protect your skin health this winter, consider adding the following steps to your skin care routine: Stay Hydrated. Water is a key component of a good skin care routine year-round, but it's especially important during the winter months when your environment becomes drier. Dehydrated skin is more prone to irritation and may become rough, itchy and flaky. Consuming the recommended 8 glasses of water a day can keep your skin supple and smooth and reduce the appearance of wrinkles. When you shower or wash your face or hands, you strip your skin of the natural oils it needs to lock in moisture. It's important to apply a moisturizer immediately after bathing and before dressing, to replenish your skin barrier with oils that can lock in moisture throughout the day. During the winter months, a heavier, cream-based moisturizer with emollients is recommended in place of lighter, gel-based moisturizers or lotions. Because emollients are heavier, they can take longer to absorb into the skin. Overnight treatments are a great way to allow emollients to replenish your skin with oils and nutrients it needs.



CHRIST CHILD SOCIETY OF TOLEDO WHERE LOVE LEADS TO ACTION

The Christ Child Society of Toledo (CCS Toledo) is welcoming new members to their all-volunteer, non-profit organization. The Christ Child Society founder, Mary Virginia Merrick, advocated that personal contact with the needy for the love of Christ develops true charity and gives it vital force. The number of children in our community living in poverty and in need of resources is growing. We invite

CCS Toledo volunteer members can choose to participate in a variety of programs and projects that we offer to serve the needs of underserved children. CCS Toledo's largest program is CLOTH-A-CHILD. Each Fall the organization purchases and distributes over 2,000 new winter coats, hats and gloves to children from birth to eighth grade. We work with local schools and social service agencies to identify the kids in need. Each child also receives an age-appropriate new book with their coat to promote literacy. Last year we included a hygiene bag to the school children from fourth to eighth grade who received a coat. The bag contains essentials such as toothbrush & toothpaste,

Tutoring students in Reading and Math skills at four local elementary schools is a favorite program for CCS Toledo members. Running and staffing the school libraries at two of the schools is also a CCS Toledo program.
