Dear People of God,

This week we celebrate St. Patrick's day, What began as a solemn recollection of the life and ministry of a saint devoted to liberating the enslaved and raising up the poorest of the poor has become a time of revelry and excess, rivers died green and lots of music. It might surprise you to know that at one time, Patrick was not considered the primary saint of Ireland. Bridget of Kildare, Brendan the navigator and Columba of Iona were all revered with Patrick as significant saints of the Emerald Isle. Patrick was not a native which explains his having to share the honors. He was the child of a Roman and a Welsh woman. Kidnapped as a young teen, he spent six years as a slave often working with the sheep and shepherds from whom he learned of the tragic situation of most of the Irish. After escaping to Britannia, he felt a call to the priesthood and traveled to France where he studied and was ordained. On returning to Ireland as a missionary, he boldly converted both the rich and the poor. He was buried in Armagh in Northern Ireland after a lengthy fight over where he ought to lay for all eternity.

It was St. Columba of Iona who decided to make use of Patrick's life as a model for the people he was converting, largely not in Ireland but in Scotland. Columba dis-entombed Patrick and removed several important relics which he used as symbols of the saintly life of Patrick. He distributed the writings of Patrick which gave them an importance which brought Patrick to the fore and placed him at the top of the patronal list.

Unfortunately, today few people know the real Patrick and don't take time to pray or commune with the God for whom Patrick lived and died. Few know his most famous poetic discussion of the Trinity even if they do know the legend of the shamrock.

I bind unto myself today

The strong name of the Trinity,

By invocation of the same

The Three in One and One in Three.

We might all do well to consider what he had to say rather than the Jiggs Dinner or tinted green beer (does anyone still do that?) so that as we celebrate those fine additions to the day, we know why we've added them. Ideally an awareness of the life of St. Patrick will enhance your celebration of this nationally recognized day.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call the church @ 419-243-1829.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.



SSI provides monthly payments to adults and children with a disability or blindness who have limited income and few resources. 
