Dear People of God,

As I hope you know because I've mentioned it several times already, the southern half of the Teresa of Calcutta Deanery is currently being reviewed as part of the Diocesan International Planning process. For some reason any time this comes up, rumors get started that the "parish is on the chopping block." Not so.

Intentional planning certainly examines the current and projected future demographics which will affect the health of a parish, but there is no plan to put any parish on the chopping block. The idea is to look for the best way to prevent that from happening by undertaking strategic changes which assure the life of the parish can continue and that there will be sacramental ministers available to assist with the various service ministries.

Obviously, in a region where the numbers of people coming to Mass are declining, intentional planning is looking for ways to reverse that trend. Part of that effort must come from the parishes which develop ways and means of advertising themselves and what they're doing because people won't just wander in and suddenly discover that the parish has programs which are life-giving and extraordinary. Parishes should also be developing long-range strategic planning which addresses the demographic issues faced by the territory in which the parish functions. Where possible and necessary, the diocese will undertake those same efforts and work in partnership.

However, let's be honest. The life of a parish depends on parishioners who (a) come to the services, (b) support the ongoing daily needs of the parish and (c) are willing to address large-scale capital needs as they arise. Where people become lax about any of those three essential issues, the parish may well have to face some very difficult decisions. If rumors of imminent closing circulate, all three of those essentials can suffer so please: be positive and supportive and all will continue to be well. And keep diocesan parish health in your prayers.

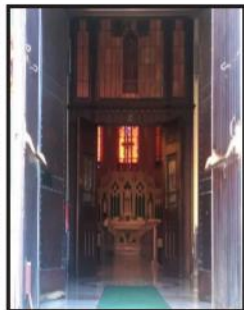

**Penance:** The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony:** Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

**Pastoral Care of the Sick:** When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

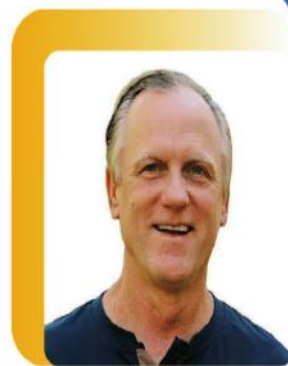
**Benefits You Can Apply for Online at [ssa.gov](https://ssa.gov):**  
**Medicare.** Medicare is a federal health insurance program for: — People age 65 or older. — Younger workers who have received disability benefits for 24 months. — People with end-stage renal disease (ESRD) or Amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS).  
 Note: They do not have a two-year waiting period. If you are not already receiving Social Security benefits, you should apply for Medicare up to 3 months before turning age 65 at [ssa.gov/medicare](https://ssa.gov/medicare). You should consider your Medicare options even if you are still working and covered under an employer group health plan (or your spouse's employer health plan through their active employment).

## JUBILEE 2025: PILGRIMS OF HOPE PLENARY INDULGENCES

**WHAT IS A PLENARY INDULGENCE?** A plenary indulgence is a grace granted by the Catholic Church through the merits of Jesus Christ to remove the temporal punishment due to sin. The indulgence applies to sins already forgiven. A plenary indulgence cleanses the soul as if the person had just been baptized. Plenary indulgences obtained during the Jubilee Year can also be applied to souls in purgatory with the possibility of obtaining two plenary indulgences for the deceased in one day, according to the Apostolic Penitentiary.

The Jubilee Indulgence is a special plenary indulgence available to the faithful during the Jubilee Year.

**HOW TO GAIN A PLENARY INDULGENCE** This indulgence can be obtained – given the completion of the ordinary conditions – through pilgrimages, pious visits to holy sites, or works of mercy and penance. To obtain an indulgence, the usual conditions of detachment from all sin, sacramental confession, Holy Communion, and prayer for the intentions of the pope must be met.

#### Make a pious pilgrimage to one of the designated pilgrimage sites

A pious visit includes spending a "suitable" amount of time during a prayerful visit in Eucharistic adoration, either in exposition or before the tabernacle, meditation, and concluding with praying for the intentions of Pope Francis, the recitation of the Our Father, any legitimate form of the Creed, and invocations to the Blessed Virgin Mary.

#### Ordinary conditions for plenary indulgence

To obtain any of the plenary indulgences the following conditions must be fulfilled:

- Detachment from all sin, even venial.
- Sacramental confession, Holy Communion, and prayer for the intentions of the pope. These three conditions can be fulfilled a few days before or after performing the works to gain the indulgence, but it is appropriate that Communion and the prayer take place on the same day that the work is completed.
- A single sacramental confession is sufficient for several plenary indulgences, but frequent sacramental confession is encouraged to obtain the grace of deeper conversion and purity of heart.
- For each plenary indulgence that is sought, however, a separate Holy Communion and a separate prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father are required.
- The prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father is left up to the choice of the individual, but an Our Father and Hail Mary are suggested.
